If you intend to purchase a package, please ensure that your child's envelope is handed in prior to, or on photography day.

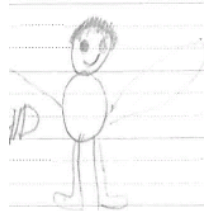
## Inside the Classroom - Year 3/4—6 Sentence Stories

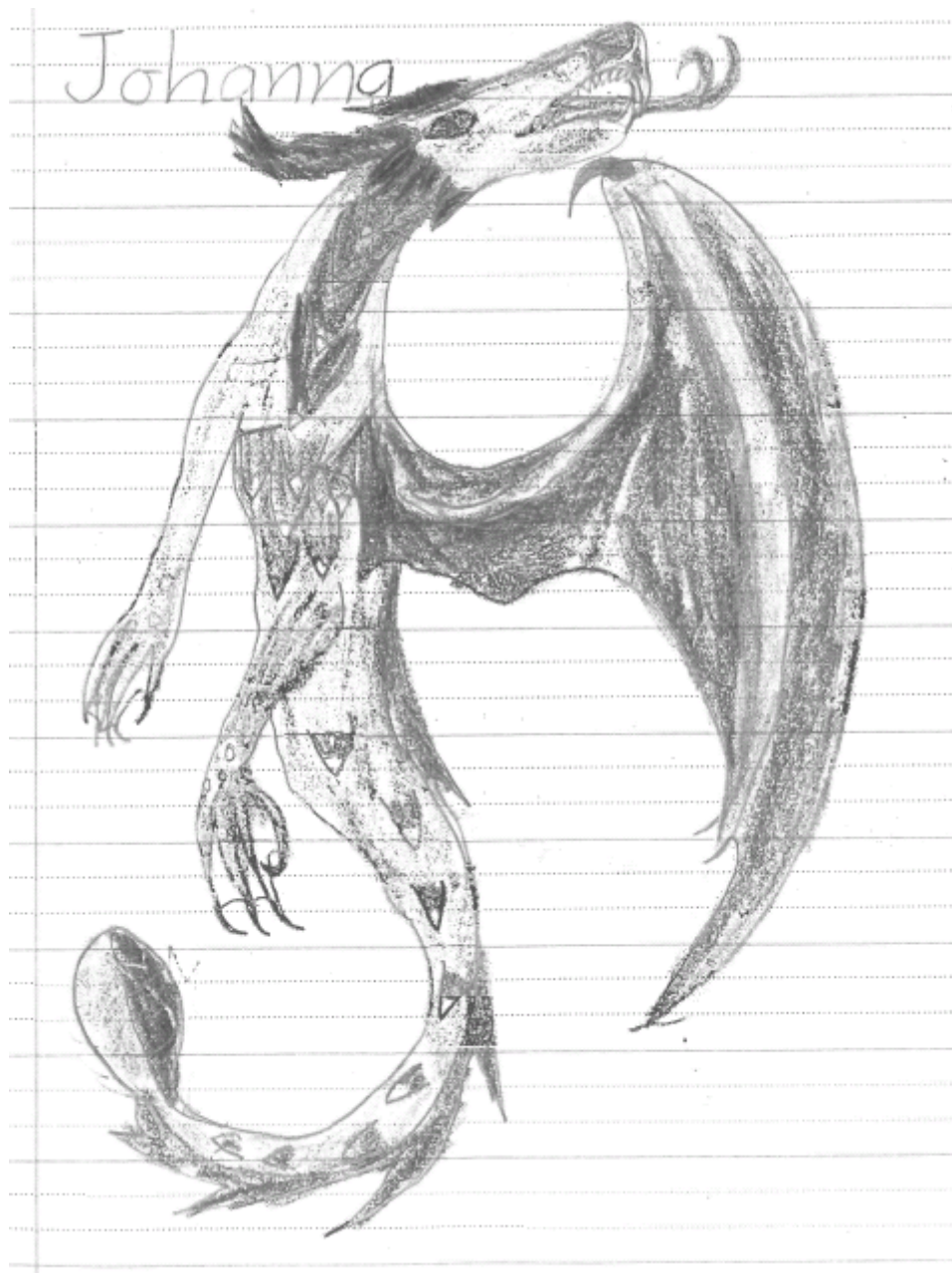

## From Our School Chaplain

### **Sowing Seeds Of Future Success Into Your Children**

Hi Parents, just like it takes time for a fruit tree to reach maturity before it produces fruit, it also takes time to see the fruits of your labour in your children's demeanour. Like a vibrant garden, children need constant watering, fertilizing and weeding before they will bear good fruit. Your input has a huge impact on them even when it seems as though your children aren't responding to your parenting endeavours. Your patient and persistent nurturing will pay off if you don't give up. Yes it's hard to be consistent and it's tiring maintaining the family rules and disciplines, but it's so worth it when you can proudly look at your children and see good results in their behaviour and character as they grow into responsible teens and young adults.

When you demonstrate to your children that you believe in them, it will have a huge impact on their self-esteem and self-belief in their value as a person and in what they are capable of. If you point out and focus on their strengths and work on nurturing these areas rather than focusing on the negative, they will respond positively. This will help them to establish a strong internal picture of who they are and will grow over time as you continue to encourage them. So support their learning efforts but also help them to understand it's okay to make mistakes. Mistakes are a normal part of learning for us all and enable us to become stronger if we have the right attitude towards them. When your children hold you in high regard they will believe what you tell them which in turn enables you to strengthen their self-confidence and belief in their abilities.

If your child is struggling with a task, listen to their complaint respectfully and without interruption. Then let them know that you believe that they can tackle this task, although it may not be easy. Tell them that you think they are one of the most determined people you know and mention some tasks they've done in the past where they applied themselves and succeeded. Watch their confidence grow before your eyes and help them if it's needed to achieve a good result. But don't 'fix' it or 'do' the task for them or they won't learn how to problem solve. You will need to persist in your belief of them repeatedly before they fully grasp the truth that they can do it, but the resulting confidence they achieve will only add to their self-esteem and growth as a person. Focusing on their strengths and what they can do, not what they can't do, will sow seeds for future success in your children.

Remember to outline their strengths at every opportunity when you see them succeed at a task. Telling your children what they are good at develops greater understanding and builds their self-belief. As you give them positive feedback you will help them to improve their skills. Critical comments will only cause a depletion of their confidence, so be careful how you use your words when you need to discipline their actions.

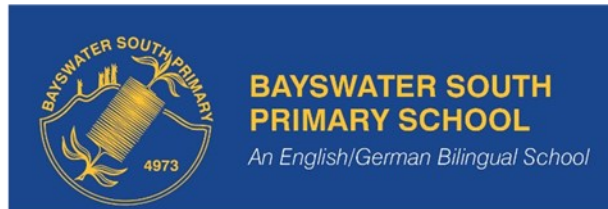
Effective parenting is about making the most of the everyday opportunities you have with your children as you interact with them. You have to put in the work to get good results. This takes great patience and persistence. Just like we need to wait to see a tree bear fruit, so too do we need to wait to see the results of persistent and positive parenting. So don't give up and in time you will bear the good fruits of your labour.

This year I am working at BSPS on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays, so please let me know if you have one hour to spare on any of these days. Here is my timetable:

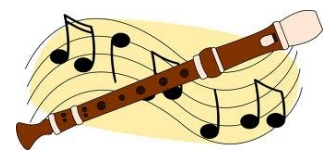

## Community Activities for You

**Knox Relay for Life** supports the Cancer Council of Victoria. Relay for Life has been running in communities across Australia for 16 years and this will be the sixth anniversary of the Knox Relay for Life.

Knox Relay for Life consists of teams who walk, jog or run for 18 hours around the Knox Athletics Track. Rest assured, you don't have to do the whole 18 hours yourself (although some people do!). Rather, your team has to ensure that your team's baton is being carried for the entire duration. Teams gather sponsors and/or raise money for participating. The Relay is also a time to remember those who have been lost to cancer or are in the process of having treatment or to celebrate with those who have beaten cancer.
