## From Our School Chaplain

### **Finishing The Job**

Hi Parents, It's quite common for children not to finish something we've asked them to. They may feel the effort needed is just too much or that it takes far too long. They'd probably rather be doing something else that's more to their liking. In a society that wants things done faster than ever, a task has to be done at lightning speed or else it's just too hard!

Here are some practical suggestions to help them grow and realise that a task isn't over until it's completed, whether they want to do it or not.

1. Be realistic in your expectation and thoroughness. If you tend to be a perfectionist then be careful your expectations are age appropriate and aren't too demanding. The job may not be finished to your standard, but as long as they've given it their best shot.
2. Make sure that they have fully understood what you're asking them to do and what the job will look like when it's completed.
3. Help them to understand that the task is important and worthy of their time and effort. You may wish to surprise them now and again with a reward if they have done it without complaint and tried their best.
4. Refuse to bail them out by finishing the job for them. This runs the risk of creating a habit in their mind that will actually encourage them to stop part way through because they expect you'll complete it.

Why not try doing part of a job one day that will affect them. An example may be for you to make their school lunch but only pack half of it, leaving the rest sitting on the kitchen bench. They will only need to go hungry one day to realise completing a task is important! I'm sure this object lesson will not go down well but if you explain the purpose of your decision, then they should get the message loud and clear.

As they mature they will have to learn that they can't get away with not finishing something, as there will always be consequences attached to this decision. If we can motivate them as children to do everything a task requires, we are setting them up well for life as an adult.
