Inside the Classroom - Year 2— 2D Shapes & 3D Objects



In Measurement and Geometry students in level 2 have been learning to name, sort and describe familiar two-dimensional shapes and three-dimensional objects in their classroom. They enjoyed going on a shape hunt matching every-day objects with geometrical shapes and objects.

Students have been practising to recognise and classify two-dimensional shapes and three-dimensional objects using obvious features such as edges, vertices and faces. During our hands-on activities they created 2 D shapes and 3 D objects using tooth picks and blue tack as well as cardboard models of pyramids, cones, cylinders, prisms and cubes all of which will be on display during our learning celebrations.

Zoe: I liked making a lot of 2D and 3 D shapes out of tooth picks. I really liked learning about shapes because in the past I forgot about them and now I know about them.

Indy: I liked making a 3 D hexagon because it was fun.

Gabriella: I liked making the tooth pick shapes because you could make whichever shape you wanted to.

Jordan: I liked making a 3 D cube because I could draw a pattern on it.

Ashish: I liked doing the paper models because when I first got to do them, there were hard ones and easy ones. I choose a hard one and I got a friend to help me and it was very helpful.

Wynetta: I enjoyed shape packman because we counted edges and corners and you had to guess the shape.

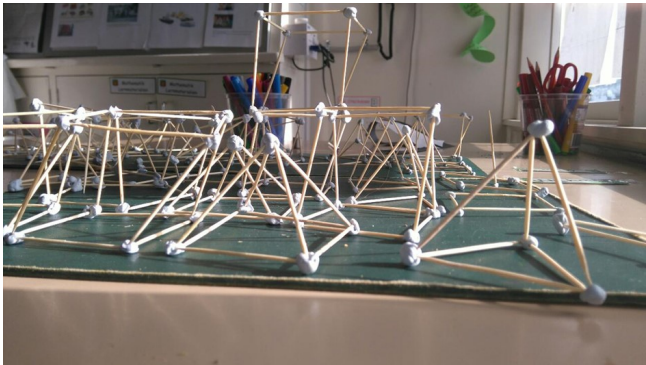
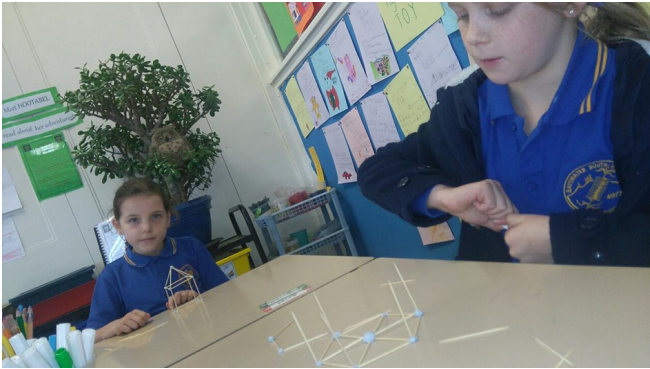
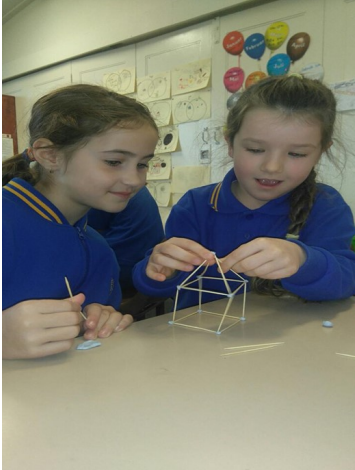
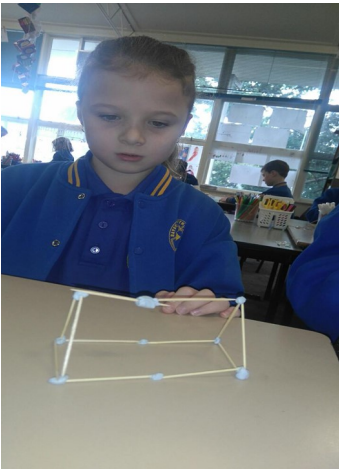
