Principal's Message– IB Candidacy Granted

Dear Parents, staff and students,

I am very pleased to announce that I received a letter this week from the International Baccalaureate (IB) organisation informing us that Bayswater South has been accepted for candidacy. It is a major step in the continued development of the school. So congratulations are in order to the whole school community for their work last year in the main, in firstly, analysing to see if this is a positive step for the school and secondly, contributing to the application process.

So what does this now mean? It means we are now on a journey to *authorisation*. This journey will take 1-2 years before we have an evaluation visit to see if we satisfy IB criteria and then once satisfied we will be officially recognised as an IB school. We will learn further over the journey what this means, but essentially it means we as a school meet educational standards on an international and national level. It will further enrich our program and therefore in turn, make a difference to the developing minds of our students.

The formal candidacy stage begins September 1, 2017. I will further brief our community of what you can expect through this stage around this time.

Congratulations once again to our community on a major stage of development for our school and it is something we should be proud of.

Finally, a reminder that our school production is fast approaching so make sure you get your tickets for one of the big events of the year!

Love Languages

There is a series of extremely helpful books by author Gary Chapman which have identified that there are 5 ways that all people give and receive love. Each of us falls into one of these categories and understanding this can be very useful to know how best we relate to others. Also if we identify our family member's preferred love language it will help us to understand the best ways to interact with and relate to them.

The 5 Love Languages are:

Words of Affirmation - If this is your love language then unsolicited compliments mean the world to you.

Quality Time - for these people nothing says I love you more than giving them your undivided attention.

Receiving Gifts - not materialism, but rather the love and thoughtfulness behind a gift means so much to these people. It doesn't mean you have to frequently buy them presents, it could be simply putting a love note in their lunchbox.

Acts of Service - when you do something for these people even something small like making their school lunch, they feel loved and cherished.

Physical Touch - these people feel loved when it's shown in ways like tousling their hair, giving them hugs or patting them on the back.

When you want to motivate your children then think in terms of their love language to work out how best to get them to comply. If you use their love language to communicate your wishes you will most likely get a better response, and life at home will become less of a battle. If you make a request keeping in mind their love language it will be heard and received in a more positive way. Longer term, if you continue to show them love using their preferred love language, then your relationship will become stronger.

What is the BSPS School Production?

A theatrical experience, which allows all students to explore aspects of their Inquiry learning through the Arts, in a professional facility. It is an opportunity for each child to shine and perform for their families and friends.

How do I purchase Tickets?

Please note that the theatre charges a \$3 booking fee when you buy tickets online (any amount of tickets can be purchased in one booking). Alternatively, tickets can be purchased at the Karralyka Theatre with no booking fee.

Do all students perform?

Yes, the production links together many elements of the students' curriculum (Inquiry, Performing Arts, Visual Arts etc.) and the expectation is that all students participate in all performances.

Why are we having a Matinee Performance?

Ticket sales in 2013 and 2015 were very strong with near full-houses over two performances. In addition, our school numbers have grown significantly. Also, a matinee allows more grandparents and younger children to attend. The starting time of 11:00am enables us to transport the students to the theatre in time for the performance and to return them to school for the usual 3:30 pick-up and after-school activities.

What are the pick-up and drop-off arrangements?

Students will be transported by bus to and from the theatre on both days; a payment and permission form will be sent home early next term. Parents will need to organize transport to the evening performances with students required from 6:30pm – 9:00pm each evening.

Will there be a DVD?

Yes. One of the performances on the Friday will be professionally filmed (costellovideo.com.au) and DVDs available for \$25. Delivery about one week after the show. Order forms will be available next Term.

Will there be a staff item?
