Inside the Classroom - Grade 1 - Let's Plan—How We Express Ourselves

Our Inquiry Topic for this term is:

Let's Play – How We Express Ourselves.

Students explored various concepts including;

1. Function – How did our production work? How did we put it together? What was our purpose? Students contributed to their production item including choosing music, suggesting dance movements and songs demonstrating strong student voice.

2. Form – What did it look like? All students assisted in shaping their item, understanding what was needed to make our item successful, entertaining and organised.

3. Reflection – How do we know? Throughout the 5-6 weeks of learning, children had many opportunities to give positive and constructive feedback to peers and teachers. Students have had the opportunity to reflect upon their experiences from production as seen below.

This was the FIRST production for the Grade One students and they are VERY proud of their efforts and their achievements. The production process is an invaluable experience for students, where precious life skills are practiced, such as teamwork and collaboration, creativity, perseverance and performing. From Our Academic Captains

This term the students in Years 5 and 6 are studying Government in Inquiry. Our question this term is 'How does Government function in Australia?'. The key concepts we are exploring are: Democracy, Function and Responsibility. In our classes, we have been put into groups of 6 and are organising a bill (a proposal for a new law or change to an existing law) to be put to our Role-Play parliament in the next weeks. After choosing our bill topic and researching the topic, our groups will split up into a Government and an Opposition, to debate the chosen topic. In our role-play Government, each group will have an opportunity to put forward their bill to the Parliament, then the Opposition puts forward their views why the bill should not be passed, then the whole parliament will vote on the debating skills of the 2 sides, not the actual bill. Our parliament will have a Government with the Prime Minister, Deputy PM, Treasurer, etc. and the Opposition will have an Opposition Leader, Deputy Opposition Leader, etc. We will also have a Speaker, Clerk and all the other Government Roles.

On the first week of Term 4, the students in Years 5 and 6 will be going to Canberra, ACT to visit Parliament House and other places of national significance such as the High Court, National Museum and the National War Memorial. We have been learning about Government so we will be well prepared and knowledgeable when we go to Canberra. Just remember that Earn and Learn ends on the 19th of September, so bring in your stickers so we can earn all the equipment we can! Good Luck.

From Our School Chaplain

Social Skills For Making Friends Part 1

Hi Parents, children who form friendships when they start school generally find it easier to mix, and learning less of a challenge. More significantly, positive friendships have long-term implications for social and academic success. Friendship skills are a developmental skill but they don't develop in isolation. Children acquire these skills when they play with their siblings and interact with children and adults outside their family. Today's children grow up with fewer siblings, fewer opportunities for unstructured play, and less freedom to explore friendships than children of even ten years ago did. As parents you can help your children develop important social skills by teaching them sociable behaviours at home, by being good role models and providing opportunities for your children to play with others in a variety of situations.

Here are 3 important social skills to help your children's development:

1. Expressing Themselves So You Understand What They Want

Help your children understand how to express clearly what they want. This doesn't mean they throw tantrums, whinge and sulk to get what they want, or expect others to know automatically what's on their mind. But it's about learning to express their desires and communicating clearly. While we need to be patient with toddlers, we also need to give older children the chance and opportunity to ask for what they want. Sometimes we need to ignore shrugs and grunts and expect them to articulate their wishes. This is a foundation of polite behaviour as well as a basic communication skill. But be patient and don't pressurise them to answer you. It can take time, trust and encouragement to give them the courage to open up to you.

2. Good Manners

Teach children good manners, in particular to say please and thank you. These words are very persuasive because they have a way of breaking down barriers and people's defences. They are the basis of good manners and when used well, will increase the likelihood of a good response from others.

3. Sharing

Sharing is a basic social skill. Developmentally, very young children like to keep their possessions themselves. As they get older the notion of sharing becomes a pre-requisite for playing with and forming relationships with others. Other children like to play and be with those who share their time, possessions and space with them. Sharing is the start of empathy as it shows sensitivity to other people's feelings.

In two weeks time, Social Skills For Making Friends Part 2 will follow.

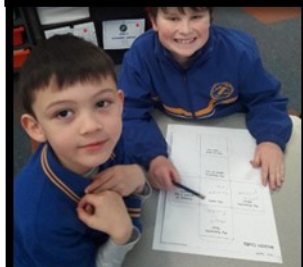
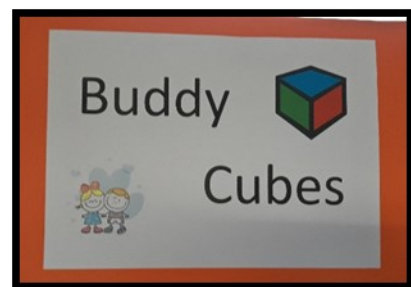

Thank you for your Expression of Interest for funding under the Victorian Government School Shade Grants Program (the Program).

The third application round saw significant interest from schools across Victoria and was highly competitive with close to 400 submissions received. Submissions were systematically shortlisted using criteria outlined in the application guidelines, including melanoma incidence rates, need for shade relative to other applications, and current level of shade available. Consideration was also given to equitable distribution of grants across the state.

I appreciate the effort your school has made in applying for a shade grant. Unfortunately, due to the very competitive nature of the Program, Bayswater South Primary school has not been shortlisted on this occasion.
