Principal's Message– Playground Regeneration Update

Dear Parents, staff and students,

Over the past number of years, Bayswater South has been committed to not only providing the best educational platform possible but also working diligently in upgrading our school resources. In a short period of time, we have successfully through careful financial planning, Government funding, parental financial contributions and fundraising upgraded our school grounds and gardens, added a synthetic grass area, renovated the Prep /office area, renovated the Year 5-6 portables, repainted our toilets and removed our old portables. We have also invested heavily into IT equipment to essentially now be in the position to have 1 to 1 laptops for our year 5-6 level, and 1 to 2 laptops/ipads for our year Prep -4 levels, developed a new media room and invested in our wellbeing programs such as The Leader in Me and Berry St.

While we intend to upgrade the Year 1-2/Arts building, we have this on hold for a short time in the hope that we will receive Government funding to assist us with this important project. But for now, our immediate project is Playground Regeneration A and B, namely the oval and the old portable site. So this week, I will bring you up to speed on the developments there. Firstly, the oval, currently we are at the planning stage and we have received advice from many sources of how we can develop this area. Importantly in developing this area, we are also intending to address some age old drainage issues we have. The intention is to develop the oval while at the same time setting up a new drainage system. Over the coming holidays, we will receive a land survey which will better inform the engineers and us of what we can actually do with this area. It is expected that in term 4, a decision will be made of what we will go for and the design and tender process will commence. It would be hoped that by the end of the year, the school will have come to a decision and works will be organised for the holiday period or the start of next year. We are hoping by term 2, 2018, this project will be complete.

In relation to Playground Regeneration Project B- the old portable area, we are hoping to develop this area into a larger play space/ friendship area that will connect the existing year 1-2 playground and prep area. Currently, classes have already presented their suggestions to the Student Representative Council, and the SRC are now working on presentations that will showcase the range of ideas we are receiving from our students. Our School Council will also be involved and will work with our parents to also receive their input into the process. At school, our staff will also be involved with the design process. Fundraising has been earmarked for this area and our Parents' club are leading the way there. So if all goes to plan we will design and plan this area for the next 6 months and then endeavour to complete the project in the second half of 2018. If you know of any company wishing to financially support the school with these important developments or you have connections that may help relating to these areas please let me know.

These are exciting times and the quest for continued school improvement continues.

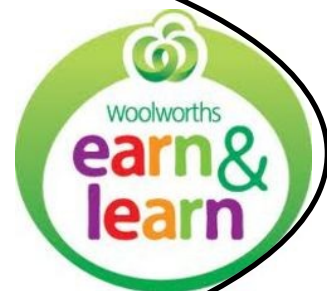

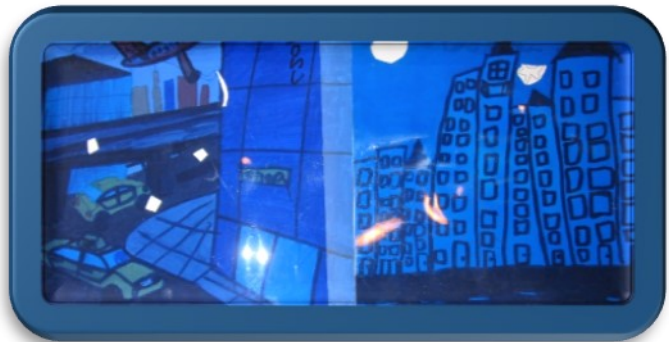
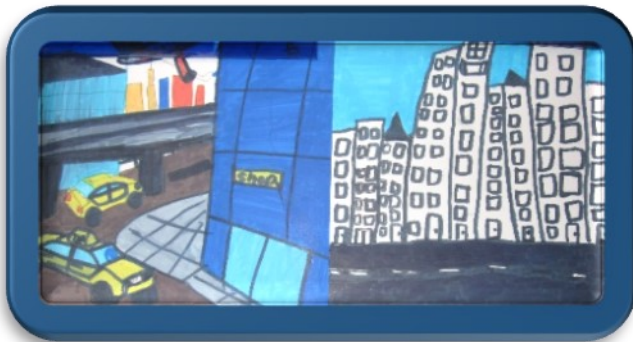

Coming to and from BPS

Lyrebird Track & 1000 Steps in Ferntree Gully

History and facts of the 1000 Steps Kokoda Track Memorial Walk: The walk was first created in the 1900's, originally made from the trunks of fern trees laid along the wetter areas to make climbing easier. In the 1950's permanent concrete steps were installed. The 1000 steps represent the 'Golden Staircase' a name given by the Australian Army Engineers and others to the track between Uberi and Imita Ridge in Papua New Guinea. There are not actually 1000 Steps, there are approximately 770 and the total ascent is 290 metres.

It's a lovely place for a walk but if you find a walk too strenuous, there is a great playground at the base of the walk where you can have a picnic with the family.

How to get there: Public transport: Take the Belgrave line train and get off at Upper Ferntree Gully station, walk east following the Burwood Highway to the Ferntree Gully picnic grounds entrance which is near the intersection of Mount Dandenong Tourist Rd. The walk starts approximately 1km from the train station.

By car: Enter the car park from Burwood Highway, there are plenty of parking spaces but it's very busy on weekends. You can park at the train station which is an easy walk to the picnic grounds. 2



School holiday activities— The William Ricketts Sanctuary

The William Ricketts Sanctuary covers four acres of beautiful fern gully land with 92 ceramic sculptures, near the top of Mt Dandenong. Situated in the Dandenongs in a ferny glade, William Ricketts Sanctuary is a place of beauty and tranquillity, due both to the natural setting and the mystical sculptures half hidden among ferns along the pathways. It is a place for quiet reflection and for contemplation of the essence of the vision of William Ricketts. Many travel across the world to visit this place time and time again. **Things to Do** Kiln-fired clay sculptures of Aboriginal figures are discreetly set among rocks, fern trees and Mountain Ash. These sculptures are an expression of Ricketts's philosophy - that all people need to act as custodians of the natural environment in the same way as Aborigines, the inspiration for much of his work. Stroll through the gardens and explore the 92 ceramic sculptures of people and animals which merge with the natural surroundings. Enjoy the audio-visual display featuring William Ricketts where visitors can see for themselves the vision and passion that live in his art. **Heritage** In the 1930s, William Ricketts bought a four-acre bush block on Mount Dandenong and called it Potter's Sanctuary. Word spread about the extraordinary sculptures that began to adorn the property. In time, the Victorian Government heard about his work and, in the early 1960s, the land and adjoining blocks were bought for the people. William Ricketts lived on at the Sanctuary into his nineties and continued to create his sculptures until his death in 1993.


Opening Hours:

The Sanctuary is open daily from 10:00am to 4:30pm daily (except Christmas Day). The sanctuary will close during dangerous weather conditions, high fire risk or for major works. Check current conditions on the day of your planned visit to confirm it is open.
