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Principal's Message– BSPS Safety Program

Dear Parents, staff and students,

So that's it, another exciting term ends full of great events such as our wonderful school production, sensational swimming lessons, Disco Bingo and colourful football activities. As I mentioned and acknowledged weekly in the school **Bulletin** all of this could not be made possible without the continued support of our staff, students, Parents' Club and community.

Now as we look forward to a well-earned break and some warmer weather, our focus turns to our final term for the year. We look forward to our Year 5-6 Canberra camp, the Cuckoo restaurant celebration, Graduation, our Gymnastics program, the BSPS Christmas Market and other school activities.

One such activity will be our **BSPS School Safety Program** that through a partnership with the Knox Council, will begin at the start of the term. The program has the backing of the School Council, who has been instrumental with their behind the scenes work. Excitingly, our students will participate in the Walk to Schools program (see brochure sent home) the Knox schools traffic safety program and in the future some Bike education. The program we believe will be important in reinforcing the important aspect of safety while travelling between places. We will also conduct a survey and the data collected will be important in guiding our school community of effective and safer travel routes and procedures.

In regards to parking, we are always encouraging our parents to set the right example and follow traffic regulations to ensure a safer environment for our community and in particular our students. After consultation with the Knox Council, our School Council and observing the traffic habits of our school, there will be a signage change along King's College Drive. Essentially it is the same in the morning except that in the afternoon there will be **no two minute drop off zone**. We are hoping this will promote a higher level of safety for our students and ease traffic flow. In taking into consideration that we will have another 45 students joining our school next year, these are important steps in promoting and developing BSPS traffic safety.

Finally, I strongly encourage our families to keep up to date by reading weekly the **Bulletin**, as we spend a lot of time producing it and *it is the official communication channel* of the school. So keep accurately informed and avoid unnecessary misinformation by reading your school's newsletter. Have a great holiday period and we look forward to seeing you all again in term 4.

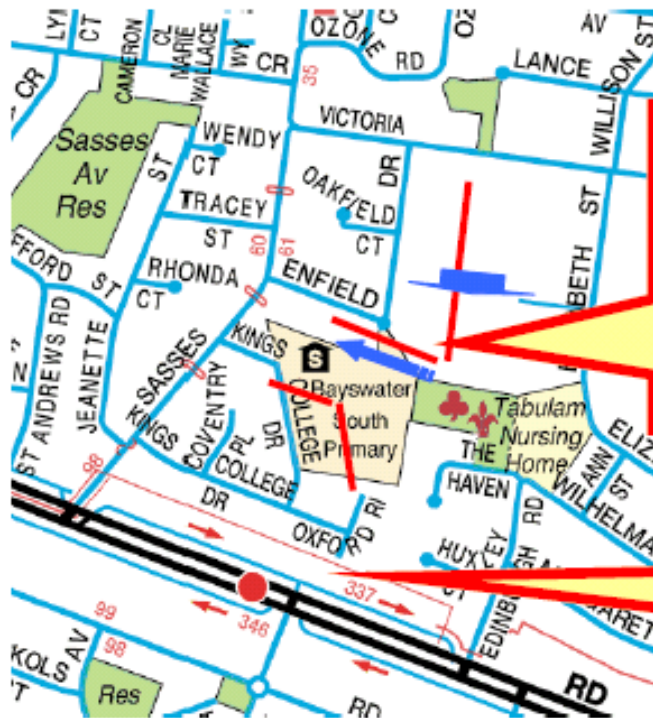


Diagram 1: Existing Parking Restrictions

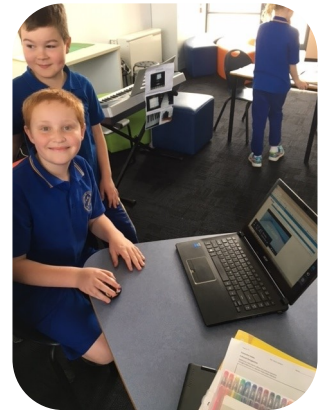

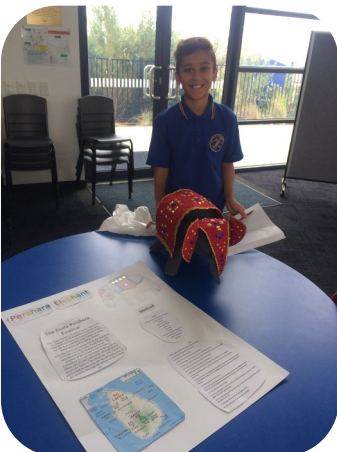

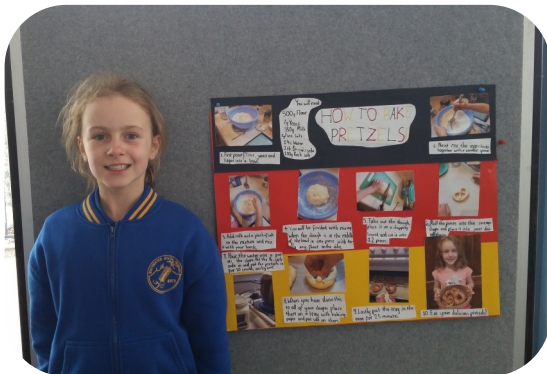
So that is how I made my hut so I hope you liked how I made it.

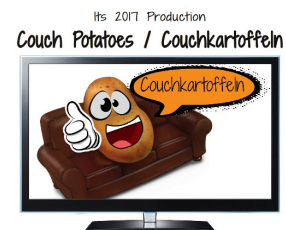
3/4 Inquiry Project by Hannah L

From Our School Chaplain

Social Skills For Making Friends Part 2

Hi Parents, here are the last 4 important skills to help your children develop socially which follow on from my last newsletter article 2 weeks ago.

4. Holding A Conversation

Holding conversations with others is a lifetime friendship skill. Conversations require self-disclosure which can be challenging for all of us. Good conversationalists give of themselves, but also take an interest in the person they are talking to. Many children forget that good conversations are two-way events and tend to focus solely on themselves. So teach your children how to ask interesting questions, to take turns when speaking, and to show that they are listening by making eye contact and not interrupting.

5. Winning And Losing Well

Children need to learn to win graciously and lose without throwing tantrums or being a bad sport. Wanting to win is natural, but children need to do so in a way that helps them maintain good relationships so others aren't put off by a poor attitude. Losing may make them feel bad, but they need to control their negative feelings so that others will want to play with them again at another time.

6. Approaching And Joining A Group Of Others

The ability to approach others in social situations is a valuable skill that can open up doors to new friendships. These skills can be learned and practised during childhood so that it becomes second nature in adulthood. So encourage your children to be brave and make the effort to mix with others even when it's hard, because once they take this step and break the ice, it will be easier the next time. Taking small, brave steps even when it's scary is a good skill to develop and will not only help your children when young, but on into adulthood.

7. Handling Fights And Disagreements

Disagreements happen in families and among friends. The key is to make sure disagreements don't lead to the breakdown of relationships. It's important to get across to children that when they have an argument or a disagreement, it doesn't mean that a friendship is over. Strong friendships like strong family relationships withstand disagreements. In fact, they should only serve to strengthen friendships. But it's important to teach children that when conflict occurs and they disagree with someone, they must do so without attacking the other person in any way. Respectfully deciding they will 'agree to disagree' without putting down their friend or family member, is a very important skill to teach your children.
