Principal's Message– Canberra Year 5/6 Camp

Dear Parents, staff and students,

I had the privilege to attend the year 5-6 camp to Canberra this week and not only was the weather amazing but our experience was golden. I would like to highlight a number of experiences and thoughts that made this excursion so unique.

I do not think we can under-estimate the challenges associated with going on such a long travelling camp for the students. The buzz word these days is resilience and this is one experience that draws upon that quality in spades. To leave one's family; to live in a space with 3- 5 others; to experience intensive educational opportunities; to travel from one place to another; to be required to eat food not cooked from home; to get up early; to give up electronics and constantly work as a team etc. requires a high deal of resilience, patience, determination and open mindedness.

When I reflect on our year 6 group and consider their journey, I am very proud of how far they have come with their group maturity and leadership, as displayed throughout the camp. They have provided a wonderful example to our year 5 students of what it takes to be a leader of our school in this instance. I know I left Canberra knowing that this experience will have a lasting influence on our future year 6 school leaders.

I suppose, as we spoke about it on camp, the importance of belonging and feeling it within a group makes a big difference to what a group can achieve. That sense was evident when the group examined our Federal Government and considered the roles we all play also in our own communities. I have no doubt that this learning experience will be instrumental in the development of our students as they progress through life. The High Court visit for example may result in someone aspiring to be the next judge, barrister, and solicitor or simply have an interest in politics. Parliament is all about serving and if every one of our students serves their country, local community, local organisation or family well, we will have a country and life to be proud of.

So thank you to our families for supporting this excursion and being an important figure in the life of your child. I believe it is a gift that will be long lasting. A big thanks to our staff- Mark, Annette, Kiran, Petra and Andreas, for your professionalism and care for our school and students, and for making this experience possible for our students. While we take too many things for granted these days I know our school community truly appreciates the time you have taken away from your own families to accept the major responsibility of looking after around 50 students away from home, travelling interstate and combating the intensive 15 hour work days. 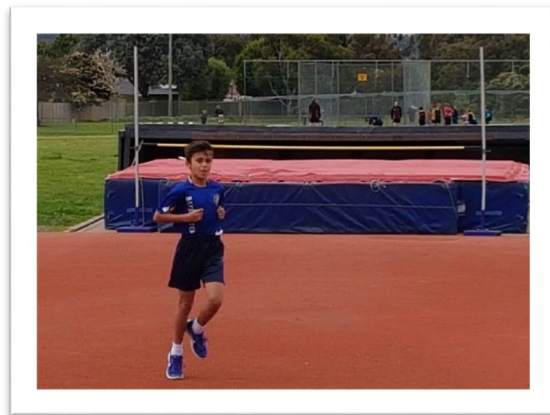
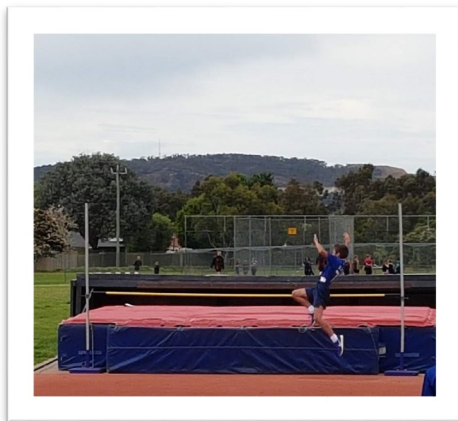

Knox Division Athletics Carnival Wednesday 11th October

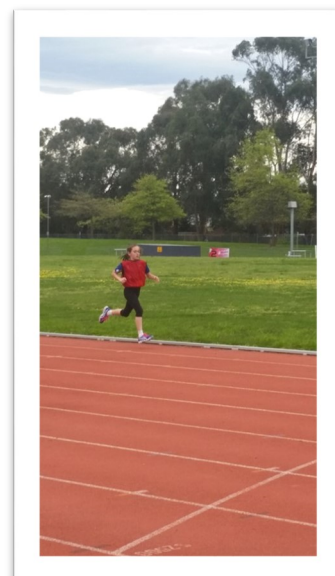
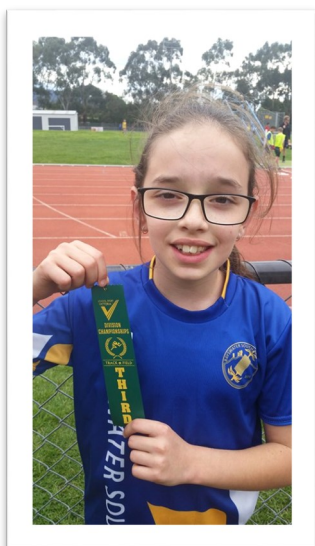

Diagram 1: Existing Parking Restrictions

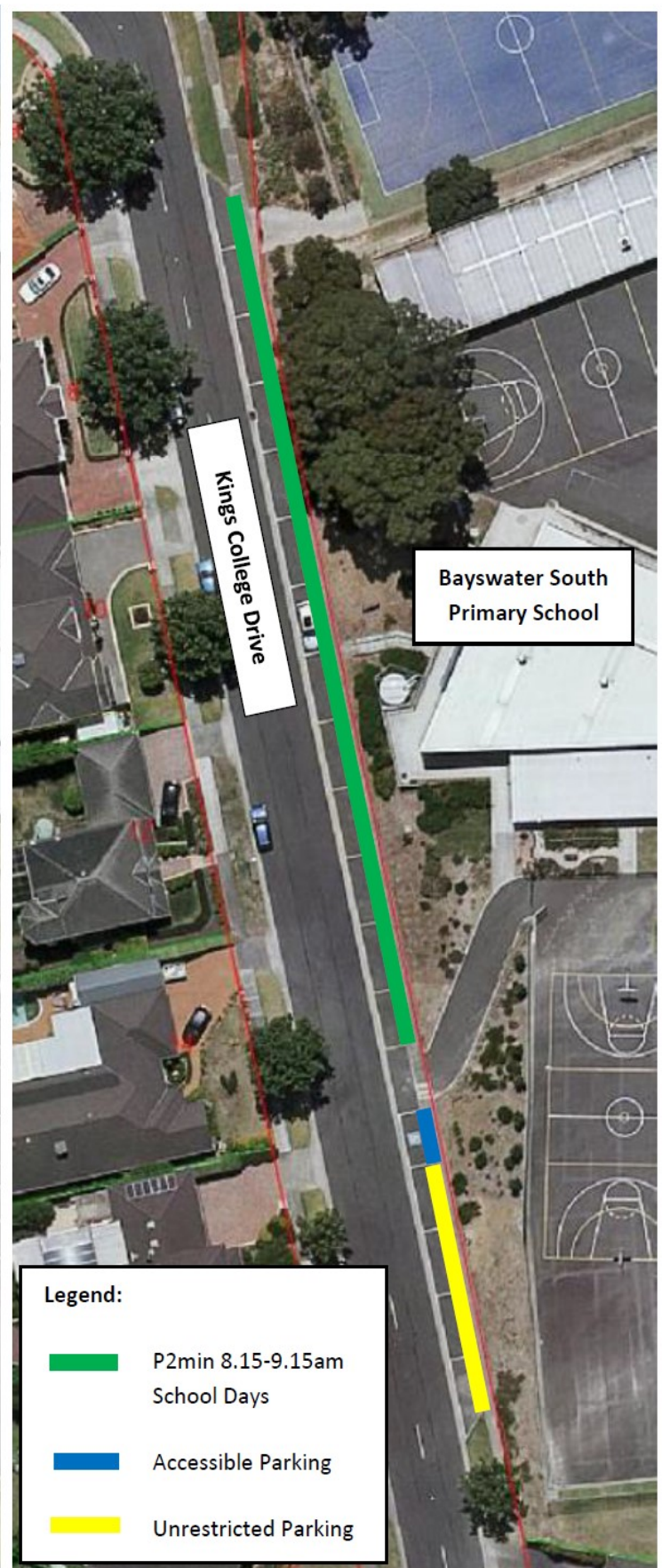


Diagram 2: Proposed Parking Restrictions
