ICT Update

Dear BSPS community,

Last year along with the implementation of our 'Sentral' student management software for staff, many parents also registered on the 'Sentral Parent Portal' which gave access to student attendance, reports, newsletter (Bulletin) and your personal information. Since this initial roll-out we have been awaiting a re-release of this parent portal with much more information and usability and I'm happy to say it is now available for you to access both on the internet and as an app on your smartphone.

Currently on this new portal you have access to the following components and features

- * Attendance alerts and information
- * Ability to communicate future absences
- * Access to Academic Reports
- * The Bulletin - through notifications and School Documents
- * School upcoming events calendar - Message Notifications to your phone
- * Ability to book Teacher Interviews

We see this new improved version as a valuable communication tool and we ask that you take the time to either register for the first time or re-acquaint yourself with the Parent Portal. As of next week, we will be communicating through the portal with messages and updates as well as using it for access to the school Bulletin.

As we all become familiar with the portal, we will be adding more information and resources to the site. We are confident that you will see the benefits of your registration immediately as you continue to be an active partner with us in your child's education.

On Friday 20th October you would have been emailed a letter with some of the following information about the Parent Portal including the very important 'App Compatible Key.' This information will help you to register and access the Portal.

If you have not previously registered and are accessing the Sentral Parent Portal for the very first time, please log on to the Internet and register for access to our Parent Portal here: <https://sentral.baysouthps.vic.edu.au/portal2/#!/register>
You must use a valid email address to create your username.

Once registered, the URL for continued access to the portal is:

<https://sentral.baysouthps.vic.edu.au/portal2>

When accessing the Portal you will be prompted to enter your Login name (email address) and the password you created. To see information from the school and to link to your enrolled children, enter the **access key** provided in the email sent on Friday 20th Oct.

Please note that the access key is case sensitive so copy it into the box provided on screen, exactly as it appears in this letter.

If you have previously registered for the Parent Portal, your username and password will still work.

If you have forgotten your password, click the [Forgot your password?](#) link at the bottom.

You will be asked to enter your email address and you should then receive an email with instructions on how to change your password.

Once logged in your parent portal will look as above



To find and install the Sentral smartphone app, go to the App store or Google play and search for 'Sentral for Parents,' download and install.

To link your account to the mobile app, when logged in, click on the 'My Details' heading and under 'My Access,' click on the blue 'Link Account' button. You will be directed to enter your username and password (the username should already be there). Enter your password and select the blue button 'I Need a New App Account.'

You will then receive a confirmation email. You will need to verify the email and then you will be prompted to enter a new password (you may choose to go with the same password again).

You will then be asked to enter the 'Access Key,' which is found on the email you have been sent on Friday 20th October.

Should you experience difficulties please do not hesitate to contact Bret for assistance.

We will be available Monday afternoons between 3:00pm and 4:00pm in the meeting room to help you register, access, use and link your Parent Portal account if necessary.

We also look forward to hearing from you about your experience with our Parent Portal, and any feedback is appreciated with a view to adding further functionality and improvement.

As we slowly walked into the beautiful Australian War Memorial, the teachers told us to be quiet because it is a place of remembrance. – Dylan T

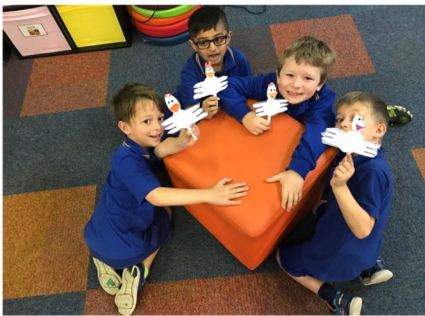
Respectfully and quietly we entered the High Court of Australia to witness the memorable dual citizenship case. – Ailish

From Our School Captains

The soft white pollen from the nearby trees flew past us and Channel 10 was filming as we walked into the High Court. It was dead silent and all you could hear was the pitter-patter of shoes climbing up the stairs. We were shown to the Court Room 2 where we were informed about the High Court - how it runs and in which circumstances people would go there. Our lovely tour guide explained to us about the Dual Citizenship case that was being argued at that very minute. We were told that we had to be silent the whole time while we were in the courtroom and that we had to bow when we entered and exited. As we were leaving we were praised on our behavior and respect from one of the tour guides.

Harry, our amazing bus driver, took us up to Mount Ainslie lookout where we could take photos of the breathtaking views of Canberra.

Finally, we made our way to the Australian War Memorial. After watching a short film, we split off into our three classes. We both are in Mrs Oates Pryor's class so we initially went to the wall of red poppies next to the names of the beloved soldiers who died for Australia in WW1 and WW2. Next, as Declan read 'The

Ode', Ryan and Jen placed down a poppy in the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. On the way to watch a short movie about fighter planes, we stopped at this old rickety boat. Our tour guide informed us that all the small holes in the boat were bullets holes. The boat actually went to Gallipoli in WW1. We then saw part of a short movie that gave us the impression of what it must have felt like flying and fighting in a bi-plane during WW1. When the movie finished, we made our way to the 'Discovery Centre'. There were four rooms, the submarine, the town house, the trenches and the helicopter.

In the submarine room you could wear uniforms. You could look out the periscope and see a computerized ocean. People could search for other ships on the radar. There was also a box where you could open and smell how an actual submarine smells like (It was disgusting but you get used to it after a while).

In the town house room there was a short film that explained how the children in towns and cities would gather pots and pans for the army so they could use it to make weapons and armor. There was a small house and a wheelbarrow with pots and pans in it.

In the trench room there was buttons and levers you could pull or press that would cause the sound effects of an explosion and gun shots. There was also a small area where you could put your foot and see how your foot looked like if you had trench foot infection. Looking at the trench foot was a little disturbing.

The last room was the helicopter, there was an actual helicopter, from the Vietnam War, that we could sit in and pretend to fly. There were many buttons and switches you could press and switch, and awesome sound effects and some screens that made it look and sound very realistic.

This is just a small snapshot of one aspect of our inspirational and memorable trip to Canberra.

From Our School Chaplain

Character Matters more than Personality

"It's not my fault, they made me do it!" Children are good at placing the blame on others and not taking any responsibility for their part in a disagreement. They often don't understand the old saying, 'It takes two to tango!' Many children deflect any responsibility away from themselves. 'I'm not to blame' can become a life long belief that if not worked through while still young, will probably cause them to have disharmony in future relationships.

Adults do it as well. Things go wrong and we often look for something or someone else to blame. We become short tempered with our children and put this down to the stress of parenting, or blame our short fuse on the hard day we had at work. Our response and behaviour can become the fault of others or our circumstances, not us. There are many ways we can deflect responsibility away from our everyday behaviour. Facing the real issues at heart takes great courage, but if you can teach your children to do so with openness and honesty, they will cope much better with whatever life throws at them in the future. It will also enable them to have much healthier relationships if they're willing to be vulnerable with other people.

One of the most powerful notions to get across to your children is that they have a choice about how they think, act and behave. A situation may be difficult but they still need to decide how they'll respond to it, how they'll respond to others, and whether they'll let it affect them both in the present and on into the future. Doing so will most likely involve forgiving others, not always easy to do. But if we hang onto 'stuff' it will probably be the cause of our undoing.

Making choices is about taking responsibility and is the mature thing to do. It's not only adults who can exhibit this maturity, we can teach our children to be responsible for themselves from a young age too. Blame or deflection takes away any choice we may have. Challenge your children when they say, "They made me do it!" There's always a choice. It's just that some choices are harder to make than others.

Here are some choices that we all face everyday -

We can choose whether to be happy or grumpy each day and whether to allow our mood to cause harmony or disharmony with those around us.

We can choose to blame others for our circumstances or take responsibility for our life and how we live each day.

We can choose to fight with others or we can walk away and not take the bait.

We can choose to follow what the crowd is doing or decide to make choices based on what's best for us as an individual.

Some of these choices are hard, no doubt. But they are choices, nonetheless. Character is developed when we make hard choices and decide to do the right thing. Resilience is cultivated when we exercise choice because it shows we are in charge of our own behaviour. Confidence is boosted, as difficult choices will take us into new ground that makes us feel uncomfortable, but this enables us to grow through having made a choice.

Don't let your children deflect responsibility or blame other people. Remind them constantly that they have a choice about how they respond to others or to their circumstances. Take responsibility for your own behaviour and then you will model first hand this valuable skill to your children. There are no excuses, that's what taking responsibility is all about!
