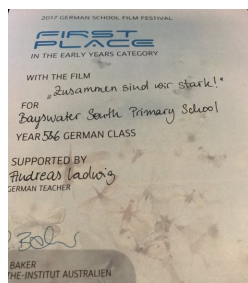

BAYSWATER SOUTH STAFF COACHING UPDATE

Bayswater South Primary School staff have been involved in an ongoing induction, mentoring and coaching program since the beginning of this year. Graduate teachers and newly appointed staff have gone through an induction program which has provided additional support, direction, feedback and essential information about how our bilingual school operates. Graduate teachers who are in their first year of teaching are also assigned a mentor whom they work with to achieve their Victorian Institute of Teaching registration. We also provide a mentoring program for other staff who would like additional support or have changed roles or returned to B.S.P.S. after a period of time.

Our coaching program has also provided staff with an opportunity to identify a goal/s or an area for development they would like to focus on for example; classroom management, assessment, differentiated learning or an area of the literacy or maths curriculum. Goals can be linked to the professional development program which is undertaken yearly. Staff have been required to identify strategies and resources they may need to achieve their goal and have then participated in a variety of coaching opportunities such as; peer observation/feedback, team teaching, one to one coaching, observational visits to other schools/classrooms and attending professional development courses. As the coaching program concludes for 2017, staff are encouraged to reflect, document their learning and provide feedback from their involvement in the program.

This program facilitates lifelong learning for staff.

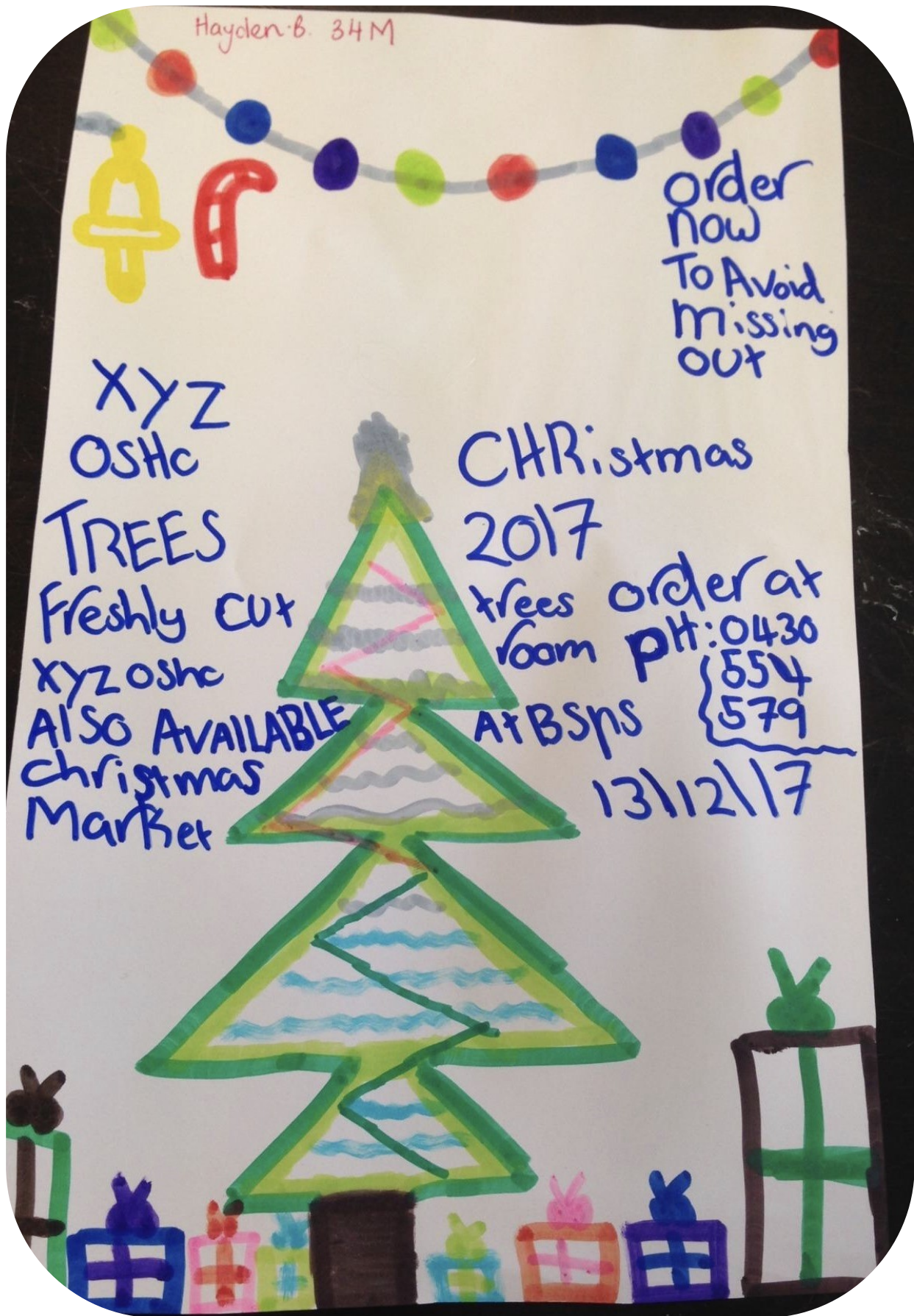
