Maths News

Mathematics

Over the last three weeks I have had the privilege to work closely with the skilled and dedicated Mathematics teachers we have here at Bayswater South Primary School. For the families who have students returning to BSPS in 2018, you will already understand the dedication and expertise these teachers demonstrate on a daily basis. For those of you who are undertaking your first year at the school, you will have already witnessed the complexity of communicating such important life skills to learners that may not be native German speakers. It goes without saying that our Mathematics teachers are expert communicators. From an adults perspective, much of the mathematics we use on a daily basis exists in the abstract where there is little or no connection to real world objects. This mathematics relies on an understanding of mathematical concepts and the use of numerals, symbols and words. While our goal is to move students towards abstraction, we still need to consolidate their understanding of mathematics in the concrete world (role playing, pictures, collections, blocks, coins and fingers to name a few). Building deep understandings concretely enables the learner to apply their thinking to a range of different situations and concepts as they actively problem solve.

At this early stage of the year, we ask that you continue to support your children as mathematicians wherever and whenever you can. We encourage students of all ages to engage with manipulatives, coins, blocks, drawings, counters, sticks, toys, stickers, etc. as they add, subtract, multiply, divide and problem solve. Opportunities to engage in this 'real world' mathematics are everywhere: when shopping, washing the car, travelling to school and saving for that new set of Smiggle Gel Pens – so be creative! Every discussion you engage in with your child that provides them with an opportunity to reason and problem solve is a worthwhile one.

We look forward to seeing your young mathematicians grow and learn.

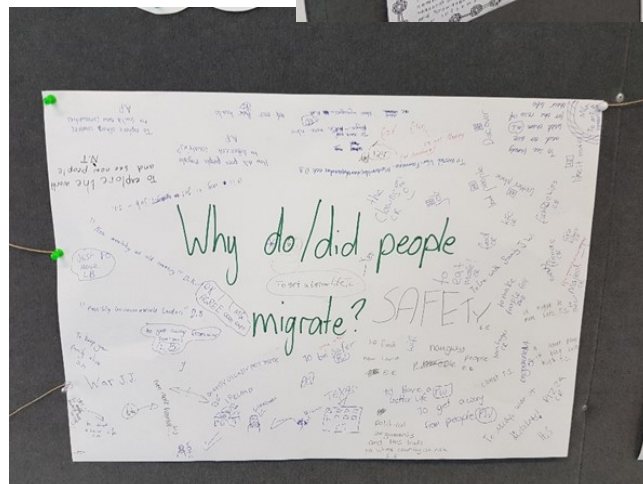
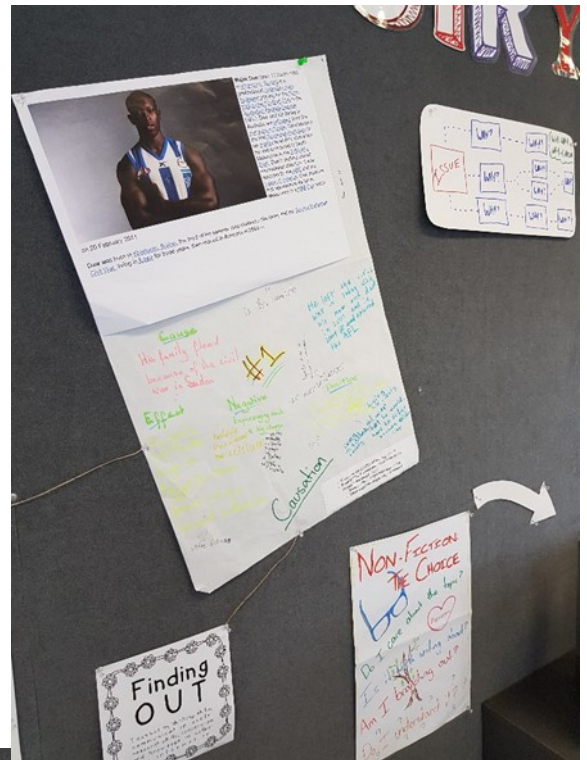

Grade 5/6: Exploring the cause and effect of migration

Our first line of inquiry is, 'The reasons for migration' which looks at **causation** as a key concept.

A refugee is someone seeking protection because they have a fear of being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, nationality, or because they are members of a certain social group. Majak Daw, the North Melbourne football player, is an example of somebody who was forced to move from Sudan during a civil war, making him a refugee.

A migrant is somebody who chooses to move for social, political, economic or environmental reasons. The Kelly family are an example of migrants who simply decided they preferred the weather in Australia over Ireland. As we go forward we will be looking at how migrants have contributed to Australian societies and other communities around the world.






I look forward to proudly representing the school community this year in council.

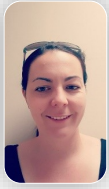
Stephen Couper
