Literacy News

Using V.C.O.P in the home

As you might know, throughout the school our teachers use VCOP (Vocabulary, Connectives, Openers, and Punctuation) to drive our teaching and dialogue about writing. As part of this, it is important that these four areas of writing are a central focus at home when students are composing pieces in their spare time.

These articles will provide some insight to what these traits of good writing look like, and give some suggestions about how you might work with your child to apply them at home. So, let's explore one of these traits: Vocabulary.

Vocabulary (Wow words!)

It is important that children begin to think carefully about the vocabulary they choose and the effect that it has on the reader. We promote the use of "WOW" words in writing. These are words that are ambitious for the children to use, and help them communicate exactly what they mean. Here is how it might look in a piece of writing:

Noun: The exhausted **youngster** trudged through the thick **mud**.

'Youngster' might help us to picture a more playful image of a young person.

Verb: The exhausted youngster **trudged** through the thick mud.

'Trudged', as opposed to *'walked'*, more clearly paints a picture of how the person is moving.

How can you help at home?

When reading with your child, talk about how the author uses specific language to 'paint' a picture.

When writing with your child, ask them to act out their actions for you. Are they acting out what is written, or does the language need to be more specific?

If your child writes, 'I was sad', encourage them to show the reader what that looks like. For example, 'A tear rolled down my face'.

These small actions ensure that our students develop the skills of lifelong writers who seek to revise their work on an ongoing basis.

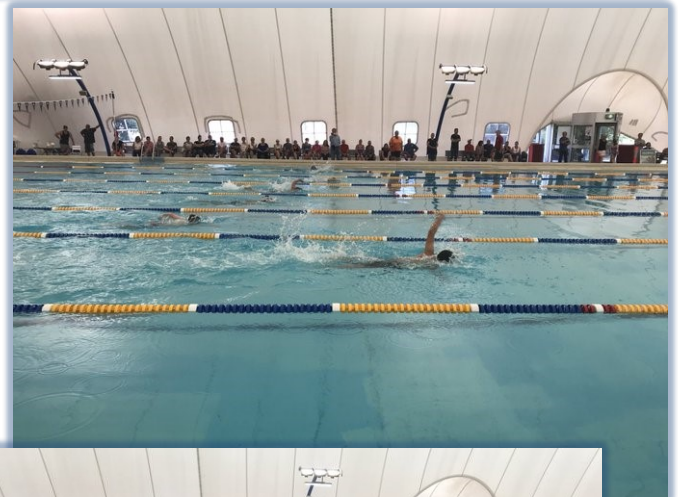
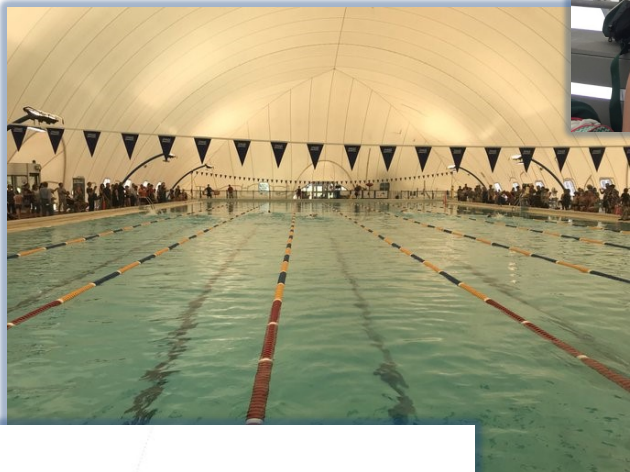

From Our School Chaplain

Good Sleep Habits And Routine Go Hand In Hand

Hi Parents, a recent study done in the UK (University College of London) found that children with irregular sleep times had lower scores in cognitive tests than of those who kept regular bedtimes. Researchers studied 11,000 British children's sleeping habits and cognitive development at age 3, 5 and 7 to see if there were connections between the two. Boys, in particular, with irregular bedtimes were more adversely affected than girls, particularly in the important areas of reading, writing and mathematics. It's widely known that sleep is good for both growth and better health. Lack of sleep also has an impact on a child's immune system. They are more susceptible to colds and other bugs because they become run down and are therefore more prone to illness.

Interestingly the key sleep factor that helps children perform better, cope with adversity and behave better at school, is the regularity of sleep habits rather than how long they sleep for. Children who go to bed at different times and wake up at different times with big swings on weekdays compared to weekends, tend to be adversely affected. Children are inclined to fight routines of all kinds, but they are actually very good for them. This includes having a regular meal time, bath time, homework time, bed time & wake up time to ensure a child's healthy development. Routine and regularity are vital for sleep too. Our sleep clock thrives on regularity. It re-adjusts in the holidays and takes some time to get back to normal when children return to school.

How much sleep do children need?

2-5 year olds: 11-12 hours per night

6-12 year olds: 9-11 hours per night

8-10 year olds: 8-10 hours per night

Here are five ideas to make sure your children's bedtime stays regular and in a good routine:

1. Don't let children stay up more than an hour or two later than normal on weekends.
2. Give them a wind down time doing something quiet before lights go out, but not TV as this will stimulate their minds.
3. No exercise, big meals or really hot baths/showers directly before bedtime.
4. Establish rituals such as reading a book in bed to trigger good sleeping habits.
5. Make their bedrooms dark. Melatonin, the chemical the brain releases to bring on sleepiness loves darkness and dislikes light of any kind.

Most parents know the importance of sleep, but it's also good to consider the importance of a regular routine, particularly at bedtime.



