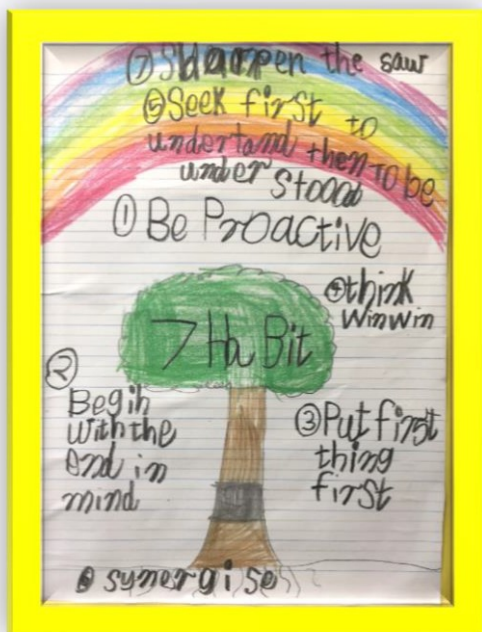

Year 2

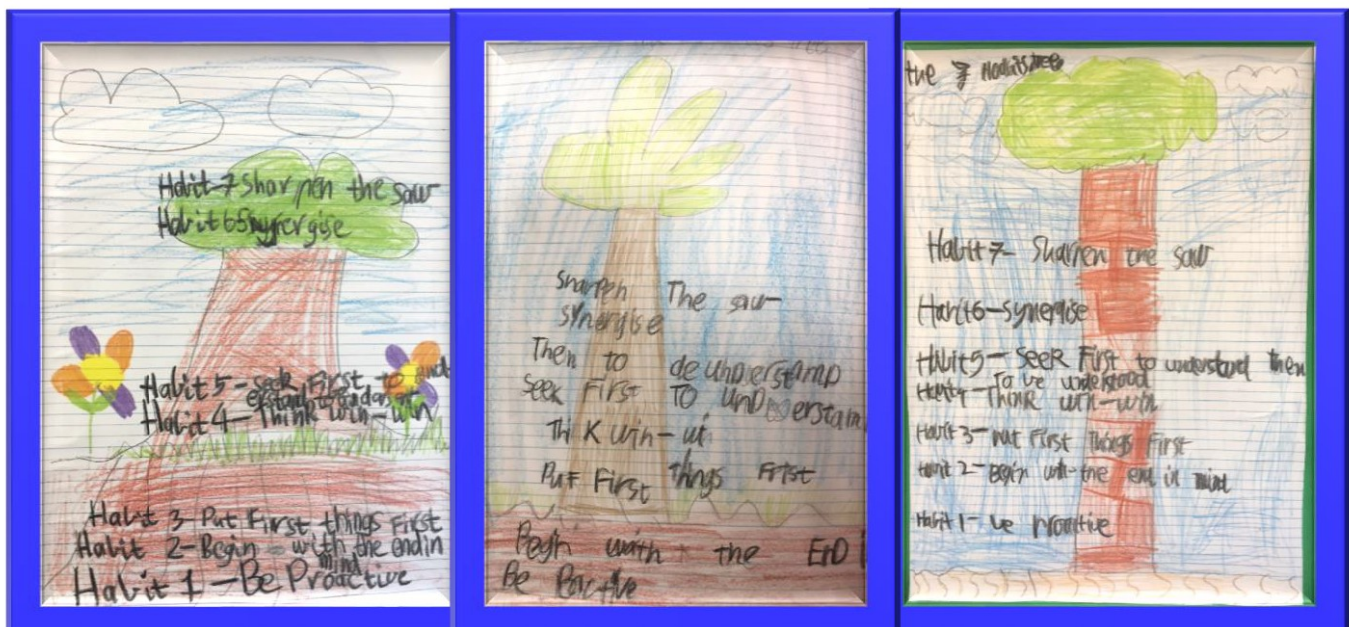

"When I was playing with my friend we wanted to play different things, so we played one game at lunch and the other at snack." (Griffin)

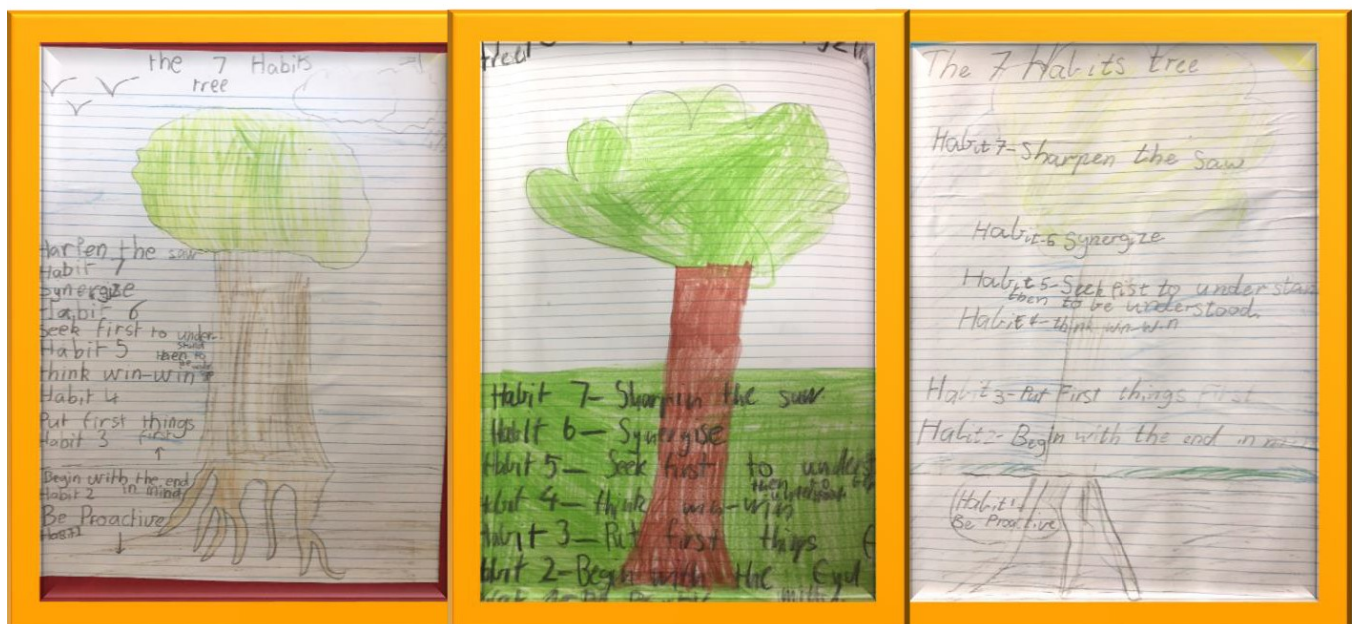


"When we did reading groups I helped people who were stuck when Miss Devilee was helping other people." (Chase)

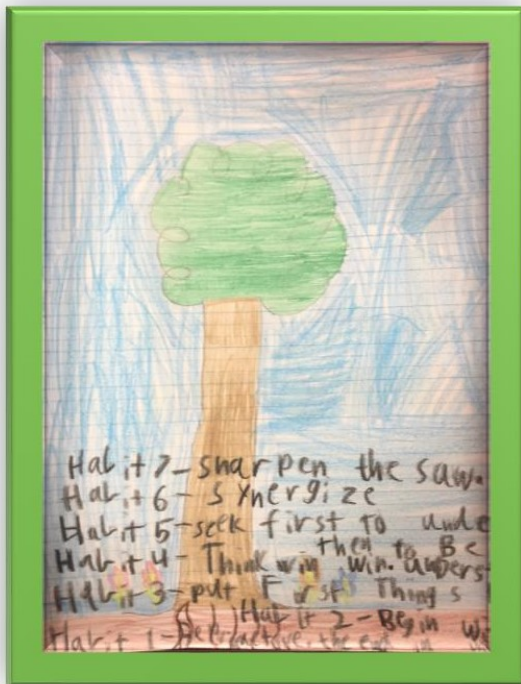
"At cricket I think of how to do it and try and do what my cricket coach says." (Sebastian)

"In Grade 1 when the music was going, I saw one of my friends fall over and I helped him by taking him to sick bay." (Riley)



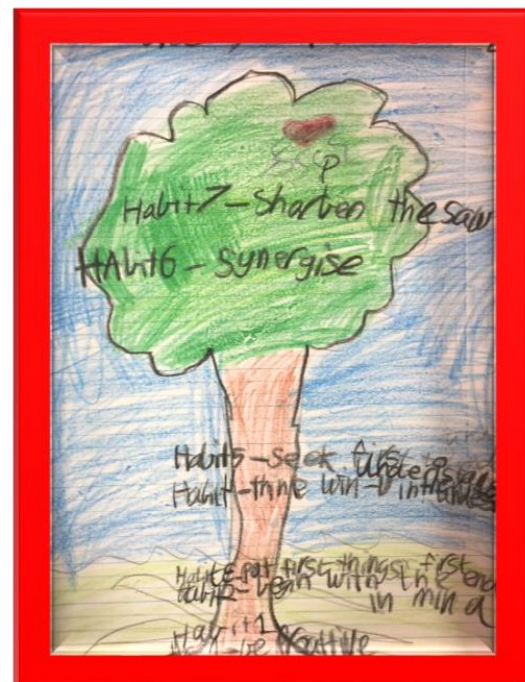
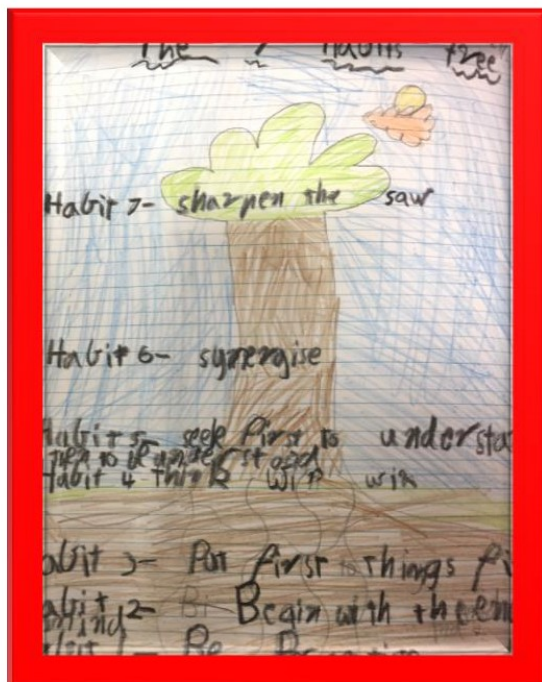

Jane Christina Flemming OAM (born 14 April 1965) is a former Australian Olympic track and field athlete. She completed her HSC in 1982 at Mater Christi College, Belgrave. She was the 1990 Commonwealth Games champion at heptathlon and long jump and also represented Australia internationally at 100 m hurdles.

DECASTELLA: Decastella, Decastella We are the best. Red is our colour we beat the rest, D E C A S T E L L A Decastella HOORAY!

Robert Decastella (born 27 February 1957) is an Australian former world champion marathon runner. He holds the Oceanian record for the marathon.

Hayley Jane Lewis, (born 2 March 1974), is an Australian former competitive swimmer best known for winning five gold medals and one bronze medal at the 1990 Commonwealth Games as a 15-year-old.

From Our School Chaplain

Teach Your Children To Shrug Off Teasing

Hi Parents, how do you teach your children to effectively deal with teasing and taunting? It's a tricky one to solve, but if any of your children wear their heart on their sleeve then they may be a target for teasing.

Children should not, and cannot ignore all negative comments directed at them. There are times when they need to stand up for themselves and also inform an adult of the situation. Socially-savvy children understand that some negative peer comments directed at them need to be ignored. But it can take quite a while to effectively hone this skill. Ignoring comments and choosing what to respond to is something many children learn in their battles with siblings. Those noisy sibling skirmishes that annoy you as parents actually toughen children up for the less than pleasant social interactions that can happen in the schoolyard.

So, if you have a sensitive child who wears his or her heart on their sleeve, or a child who reacts impulsively to both taunts and witticisms alike, you may wish to introduce the art of 'shrugging' to them. If used correctly, it can be an extremely effective response.

Help your children to practise shrugging in front of the mirror so that they can see what it needs to look like. There are 4 ingredients to a good shrug –

1. A 'whatever' look that relays an 'I'm not taking the bait' response.
2. A shrug of the shoulders.
3. Accompanied by a simple, non-combative, non-sarcastic line such as – "You may be right!" or "I hadn't thought of that!"
4. Followed by a break of eye contact indicating they are in control as they walk away.

If you teach your children to shrug, you need to be prepared that they may use this shrugging technique against you when you direct some constructive feedback their way, and will need to predetermine how you respond to this. If they do, you'll see your child use an exercise which when smartly used will increase their overall social effectiveness, and help them deal successfully with any taunts and teasing that comes their way.
