Inside the Classroom - Year 1 Learning to Count by Five

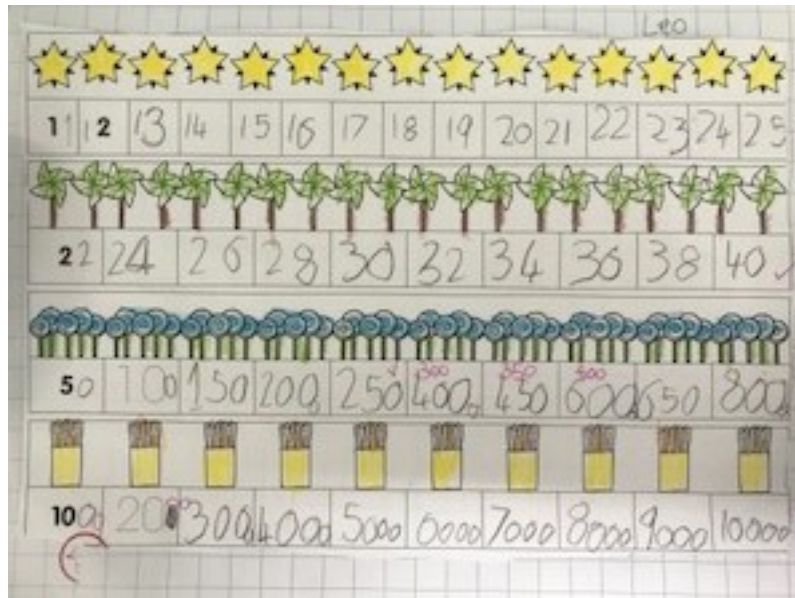

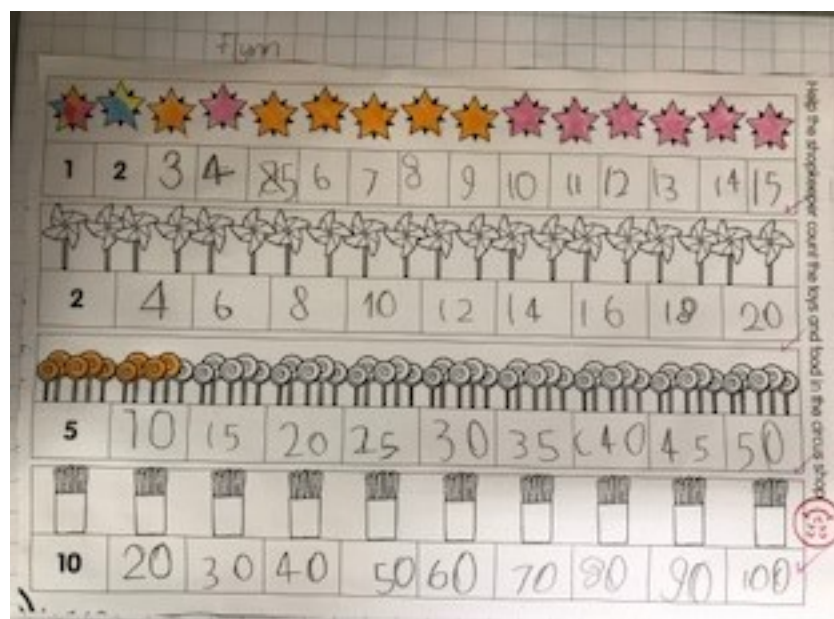
Students in Grade 1 are learning to count by 5's. We traced our hands, decorated them and then we counted.

SRC stands for **Student Representative Council**. The SRCs are helping to give all students a voice at BSPS.

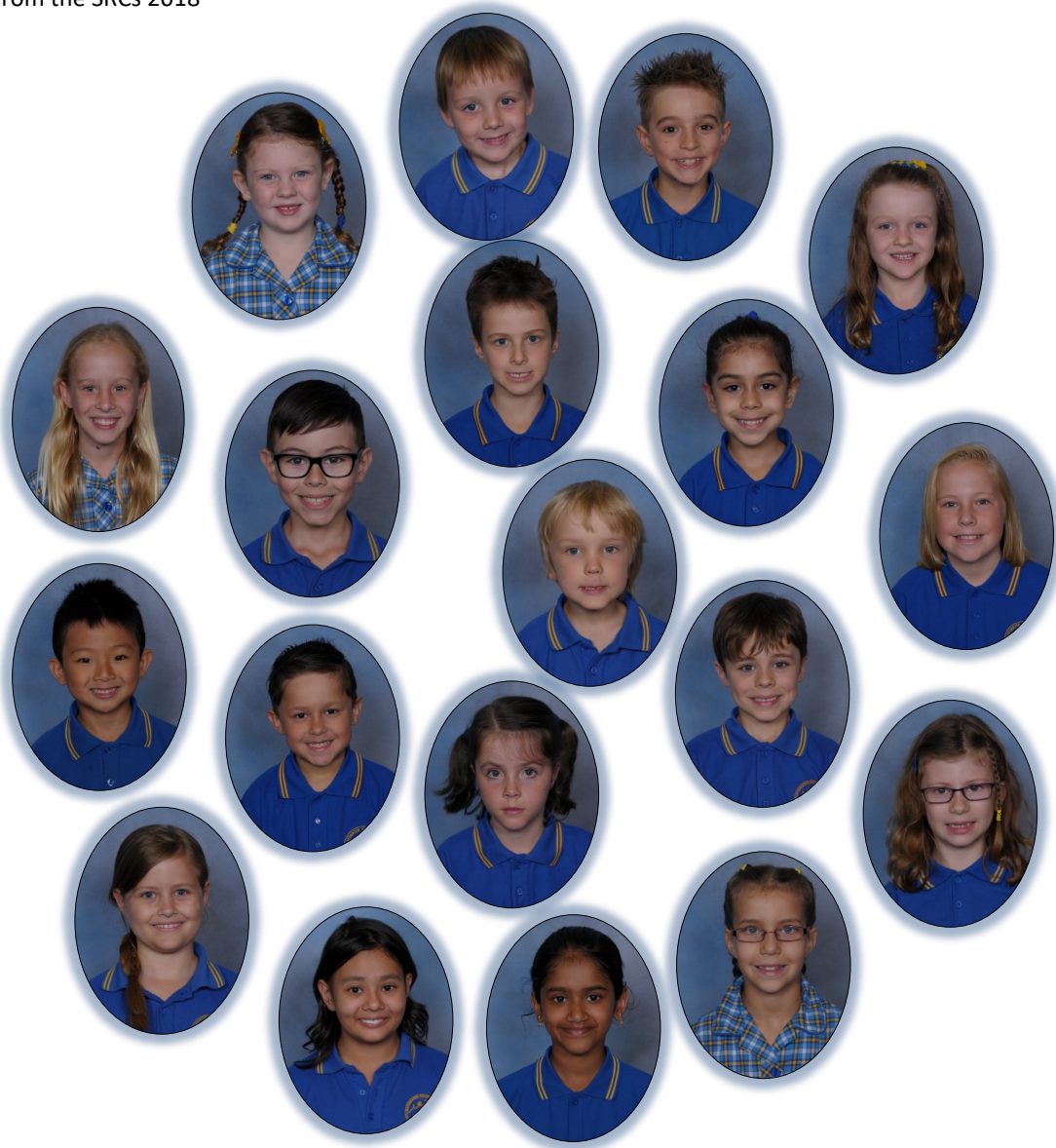


