From the Assistant Principal



Dear Parents,

The internet offers exciting opportunities and experiences for kids and teens.

While cyber safety and cyberbullying are part of the school curriculum, it's important for parents to also understand the technology our children are using and to be aware of the online dangers that exist. There are many online resources and guides that you can access as parents to get up to speed. We recommend talking to your kids about cyber safety as openness is the key and the earlier you start talking to your children about online safety, the better.

One of the best sources of online information for parents is at www.esafety.gov.au

It's reasonable to monitor your child's online activities to ensure they are using safe practices, but if you're too restrictive, you may risk them going behind your back and engaging in dangerous online activities.

Educate your kids about appropriate online behaviour. For example, you might want to discuss what kinds of websites and **apps** are acceptable to visit/use and those that are not. It would also be helpful to outline the kinds of personal information they should never share on social media.

A good approach would be to set up rules around your child's online activities and use of technology. For example, you may want to put a limit on how much time they spend online per day, what apps they can use and which websites they are allowed to visit.

Please be aware of the following apps and programs and their suitability for primary students.

Although freely available and widely used by high school students and adults, it is **strongly** advised that no primary school age students should be using these until reaching the age of **13**. An online search about these 6 apps/programs will inform you that the **legal age** to use them is **13** and over.



All of the above apps fall under the description of '**social networking**.' All of these services enable direct interaction between individuals. Users can post information about themselves, display photos, tell people what they have been up to, chat and play games. Social networking forms a part of the social identity of many teenagers.

What can I do?

As a parent, you can help your child have positive experiences on social networking sites.

- Stay involved in your child's use of new technology. Set up your own account and learn about privacy settings so you can understand how you can best protect your child. It can be fun for you too!
- Check the age restrictions for the social networking service or game. Some social networking sites (such as Club Penguin) are created especially for children under the age of **13**, but most mainstream sites like Facebook, Instagram and others require the user to be **13** or older.
- Advise children to set their accounts to private so that only people they want to see it can view their information. Report any abuse or inappropriate content and show children how to do this too.
- Encourage children to think before they put anything online. Information posted online can be difficult or impossible to remove.
- Show them how to set up location services on their phone so they are not inadvertently broadcasting their location.
- Remind children to be careful when making new friends online; people may not be who they say they are.
- Learn how to keep a copy of online conversations and how to block people prior to an issue occurring. For more information on everything discussed here, visit www.esafety.gov.au

Speeches that Matter

In Grade 5 and 6, we've been working tirelessly to craft pieces of writing that make a difference – that call upon the reader to care about the things that we care so much about. What do we care about? Well, to the right are the UN Sustainable Development Goals that we, as a society, need to achieve by 2030. We hope that our inquiry into these goals and what they might look like in the local community will result in meaningful action that makes a genuine difference. Here's an example of one of our speeches:



Imagine yourself not being able to have food to eat, feeling desperately hungry and weak, and being that person who needs to beg for food. Every single 5 minutes one child dies because of hunger, these are innocent children in our world and we need to save them.

Over 800 million people go hungry – that is 9.5% of the world. People live in fear every day because there is no food. This even happens at a local level, and we can try to solve this by planting fruit and vegetable trees, and we should take care of these as a school through watering and laying soil. By doing this, soon we will have lots more food available that will be discounted for the people who need it most.

We are delaying this by a lot, and we need to get a move on. The real unfairness being that in some countries food is not shared evenly, maybe as a result of respect. Further, in some countries, an African cow produces 5 litres of milk per day, while a European cow produces 25 to 30 litres per day, showing the difference between countries, and showing why people go hungry in different countries.

So come on, let's fix this. And while we are doing this we need to inform people what is happening. We'll be a strong team so nothing can defeat us!

We look forward to sharing all of our work toward achieving these goals at our learning celebrations in week 11 of this term!

Learning How To Cope Well When Life Gets Tough

Hi Parents, At times you and your children will have events both big and small that happen day to day that you'd prefer to forget. Finding ways to move on to help alleviate the stress and upset they've caused can be very therapeutic. So spend time together as a family, go for a walk, read a book, go fishing at a favourite spot, play a board game, or relax in whatever way works for you. It may be just the thing that helps you all to move on. Parents you can use this strategy to help your children learn a better way to deal with stress, lessen their anxiety, and forget about disappointments or worry. The key is to use distraction to take your mind off worries and disappointments.

Here are five ways to refine this technique with your family:-

Thought Stopping: Help children to park their thoughts or worries for a while. Encourage them to stop thinking about the situation for a time and focus on something different. This takes practise.

Mental Distraction: Find what physical activity works to distract them from their thoughts. Read, write, run, shoot hoops, ride a bike, draw, etc.

Move Away From A Situation: Physically remove them from a situation temporarily to relieve their stress and worry. A break from the study room, a walk outside, a drive to see friends or family, or a visit to the shops gives you all a change of scenery.

A Special Place: Help your children find the place that allows them to de-stress for a short while on their own to bring solace and gain strength. Some people find retreating to their bedroom helps them to escape the stresses of the day.

Offering Hope: 'This too shall pass' is a powerful lesson to learn at any age. Taking one day at a time is another great proverb to live life by. Learning to let go and let yesterday's problems stay in the past, can be very powerful too.

Learning to handle the small ups and downs of every-day life enables both children and adults to develop inner strength that equips us to better manage the bigger hardships, the daily frustrations, and the inevitable difficulties of life. So don't cotton wool your children to try to eliminate what life throws at them. This can be hard as a parent, but you will be setting them up to become resilient, strong, skilled and resourceful if you can guide and nurture them to face life's challenges.

And remember, a sense of humour and a light-hearted approach to whatever we face can make all the difference to how we see things, and in how well we cope with each situation. Sometimes laughter is the best medicine!
