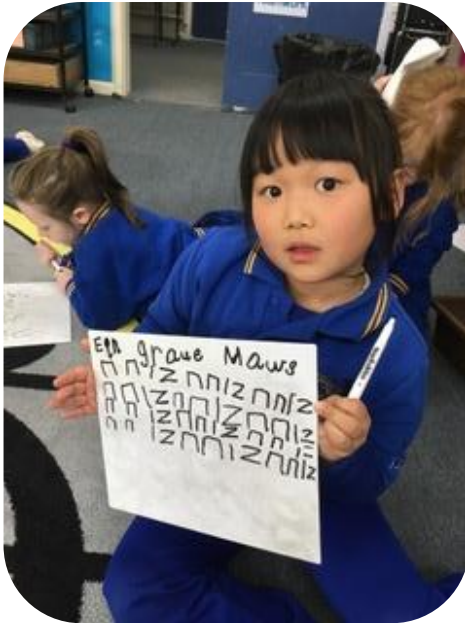

Principal's Message– Building Teaching and Leadership Excellence

Dear Parents, Staff & Students,

This week I like to share some insight into what we as a staff saw to be the highlights of this area and our thoughts of how we could further develop. The following is a snippet from the Review self study document:

The building of teaching and leadership excellence was a goal highlighted initially in the School Strategic Plan (2014-2018) with a subgoal of providing more clarity and direction around the teaching and learning of the curriculum areas. The BSPS School Vision, Mission, values and instructional model were developed and an extensive Wellbeing focus was implemented around teacher professional development. This period saw continuous discussions around SSP and AIP goals, the linking of PDP goals and the reinforcement and importance of student voice.

The streamlining of processes to consolidate our school plan by encouraging a whole school solution orientated approach was important. The development of our school culture and the growing open mindedness of our staff has been influential in the successes we have achieved and celebrated over this period.

The coaching program has been identified by staff as a key component and highlight of our development in this area. The coaching program has evolved from a mostly scheduled Professional Learning meeting time set up, to include a teacher driven approach. This year the employment of a Maths Learning Specialist and PYP coordinator has coincided with the biggest development in this area. The curriculum areas of integrated inquiry learning and mathematics have been key successes, supported by changes in the schedule and the allocation of planning time and coaching. Moving forward we would like to see more positive growth in the area of literacy, in particular writing. Key decisions need to be made in how we can best support and use the coaching model to build teacher excellence and improve student outcomes in this area. It is expected that the BSPS coaching program will mature to include more classroom visits and more critical professional discussions between staff.

On Monday, August 27th we will hold our first day of the Review, so I look forward to the quality discussion that our core Review panel will have that will guide us in establishing a new BSPS Strategic Plan.

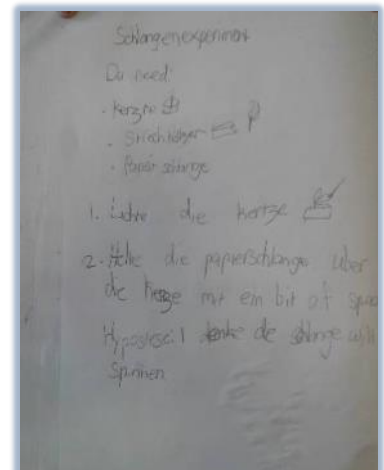
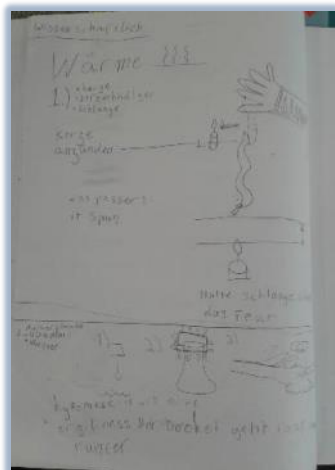
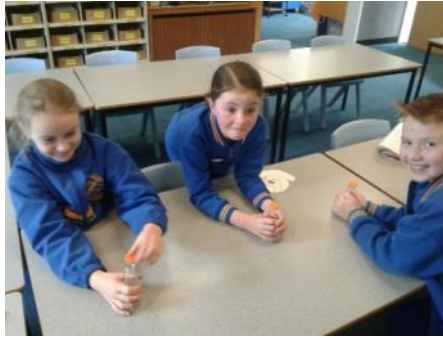
Inside the Classroom— Science in Years 3 & 4

From Our Maths Coordinator

Mathematics Learning and Teaching: Classroom Observations and Feedback

Over the last month, the Mathematics teachers at Bayswater South Primary School have been engaging in peer observations and feedback. This means that the teachers have had the opportunity to observe the practice of each other. The staff have engaged in this process for the following reasons:

- To provide targeted feedback to the teacher being observed
- To learn from each other in the process

The teachers spent time discussing their personal goals and how they would like to develop their teaching practice further (there was chocolate involved). Most of these discussions were about:

- the specific language used in classroom,
- how the students articulate their learning,
- the timing of each lesson to maximise instruction and individual learning time,
- how the teachers use student responses to guide future learning



Once the observation was over, the teachers made time to provide those they had observed with targeted feedback about their chosen goals and strategies (there was more chocolate). From this process, each Mathematics teacher had the opportunity to be observed and observe others. By giving and receiving feedback, the teachers have been able to reflect on their practice, action feedback and ultimately provide effective learning experiences for the students at Bayswater South Primary School.

How To Teach & Involve Children In Wise Decision Making

Hi Parents, it's important to teach your children how to make decisions while they're young and while you still hold the reigns. In most families there is a gradual, yet continuous giving over of responsibility and decision making to the children. It doesn't happen straight away or in one moment, but is a progressive letting go as children reach a new level of maturity and ability.

In healthy families decision making occurs in 3 ways:

1. Parents rule

Parents as wise leaders with children's best interests at heart make decisions for them about issues such as health, safety, education & well-being. Eg: You may take your children's ideas on board about schooling, but you decide the school that they go to.

2. Children decide

There are some issues that children can make decisions on but parental guidance is usually needed. This will differ for each family but you may like to give your children reign over bedroom tidiness, how they spend their pocket money, what they wear or their choice of leisure activities.

3. Family discussion

There are times when everyone should have some input into how the family operates. Children can have input into routines, sorting out joint problems like how they can all get along better, and family rules including how mobiles, televisions and computers are used to suit you all. Weekly family meetings are a great way parents can involve children more closely in decision making. This helps your children learn how to make good choices while still young, because they'll become adept at it with practise under your guidance. It also empowers them to make wise decisions both now and into the future, and helps them feel like they have a say in how your family works as a team.

You know your children have reached real independence when you stop having to instruct them repeatedly and they become responsible enough to make good choices independently, and are capable of recovering from poor ones. While on this journey involve them in family discussions so that they learn how much you value their worthwhile contribution.

Dear Parents

This letter is about the Education Department's program called SEAL (Select Entry Accelerated Learning).

I am writing to parents of schools in the Fairhills area to make sure that they are aware of the SEAL Academy at Fairhills High School so that their student doesn't miss out on the opportunity to be part of it. Our follow-up SEAL testing day is scheduled for **Saturday 15th September**. This testing is open to any student whether they are currently planning to enrol in Fairhills or not.

If your student is considered to be in the highest achieving 20% of his/her sixth grade class, then it is likely that you would be interested in learning more about SEAL at Fairhills.

Fairhills has been for over 10 years one of the 40 schools in the state accredited to offer this program. The SEAL pathway enables selected students to be in a class that progresses at a faster rate so that the students complete the normal year 7-9 curriculum in two (rather than three) years. They then follow our normal VCE preparation program as Year 10 students before moving on to VCE which they complete over 3 (rather than the normal 2) years. This enables them to study a wider range of VCE subjects, obtain higher ATAR scores and, if desired, include a first year University subject while still at school.

An important feature of SEAL schools in addition to their acceleration pathway is their capacity to also provide a range of quality specialist curriculum opportunities both formal and extra curricula. Fairhills currently has approximately 20 extra curricula options to choose from within our Independent Learning Program [ILP] arrangements.

As well as having a SEAL Academy, Fairhills is also proud to have specialist Academies in the Performing Arts, Basketball and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths), and in addition provides a range of extension learning opportunities through our Sustainable Technologies KIOSC campus (which we share with the other five Knox schools).


Some parents of Grade 6 students in government schools are attracted to private schooling at the secondary level. Fairhills High as a Government School is able to provide a strongly academic program through its SEAL and other specialist Academies at very little additional cost to parents compared with fee-based private school alternatives.

Of course students of all ability levels (not just SEAL) are welcome to enrol at Fairhills High School where we provide a personalised quality education for all, through our 'Multiple Learning Pathways' curriculum, our 'Differentiated Learning' classroom strategies and our 'Positive Behaviour' approach to pastoral care.
