Principal's Message– Review and the Productivity Goal

Dear Parents, Staff & Students,

This week I like to share some insight into what we as a staff saw to be the highlights of **goal 4 -the productivity area (Strategic resource management)**. The following is a snippet from the *Review self study document*:

As BSPS was transitioning to a 50-50 Bilingual model, it became apparent in 2014, that the then financial model was not sustainable. The staffing model based on the fact and figures of its time, allowed no room for expenditure into other key areas and did not meet the staffing requirements of the re-committed bilingual program. The challenging situation resulted a new sustainable financial model needing to be immediately introduced and implemented. In short, challenging decisions were made which resulted in the following resource management highlights to occur: a) Financial loss was kept at a minimum and corrected within a few years allowing the program to flourish b) BSPS became a financially stable school c) Extensive playground works including a synthetic diamond area, bat tennis, basketball and a redesigned oval area were completed c) Prep/ Office building was renovated in 2015 d) Year 3-4 portables were renovated in 2016-17 e) The BSPS website was redesigned and developed f) Other communication avenues were developed such as the school brochure, marketing items, our newsletter and Sentral was introduced g) BSPS went from a one computer room with a few classroom computers school to a 1-1 laptop (Years 3-6) and 1-2 Ipad (Years Prep-2) school.

The stated resource management highlights were made possible through the collaboration of staff, students and parents. Student voice was prominent in the playground works while the BSPS School Council played a vital role in supporting key financial decisions and the Parents' Club fundraising successes.

These important decisions, achievements and developments have contributed and resulted in the traditional trend of 40 students entering Prep each year being replaced by a new 3 Year trend of over 60 students. We believe the growth in this area supports the quality teaching and learning BSPS is renowned for.

On Monday, August 27th we held our first day of the Review, which was intensive, challenging but re affirming of the school's self evaluation. Next Wednesday September 5th, the Review Field Day will occur that will result in further evidence being collected to better inform our future goals.

Child Safety Standards

Bayswater South Primary School is committed to the safety and wellbeing of all children and young people. This will be the primary focus of our care and decision-making. Bayswater South has **zero tolerance for child abuse**.

Bayswater South is committed to providing a child safe environment where children and young people are safe and feel safe, and their voices are heard about decisions that affect their lives. Particular attention will be paid to the cultural safety of Aboriginal children and children from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds, as well as the safety of children with a disability.

Every person involved in Bayswater South has a responsibility to understand the important and specific role they play individually and collectively to ensure that the wellbeing and safety of all children is at the forefront of all they do and every decision they make.

We want children at this school to be safe, happy and empowered. We have legal and moral obligations to contact authorities when we are worried about a child's safety, which we follow rigorously.

Our school has a Child Safe Policy, Code of Conduct and a Commitment to Child Safety to ensure that we comply with the Child Protection legislation. These documents continue to be updated where necessary. The Child Safe Policy and our Code of Conduct are publicly available on our website. Our Commitment to Child Safety is contained within our weekly newsletter.

The Child Protection legislation places greater responsibility on all members of the school community to report child abuse and to address child safety concerns. An obligation of the Victorian Child Safe Standards is the appointment of a Child Safety Officer, who is our Wellbeing Coordinator. The Officer is available to parents, students, staff members and volunteers should they have any concerns or questions about child protection and safety.

All serious concerns for a child's immediate safety should be directed to the police by contacting **000**. Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) for the Eastern Division can also be contacted on **1300 360 391**.

Bayswater South Primary School will continue to work to provide the best possible care for the students of its school and will further embed a culture that promotes child safety involving the active participation and responsibility of the community as a whole.

From Our School Chaplain

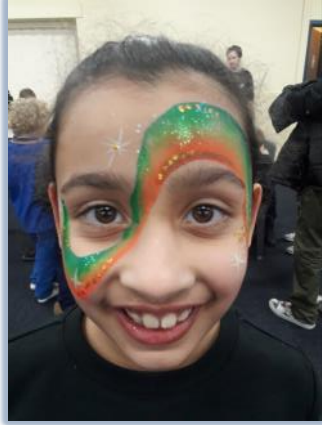
