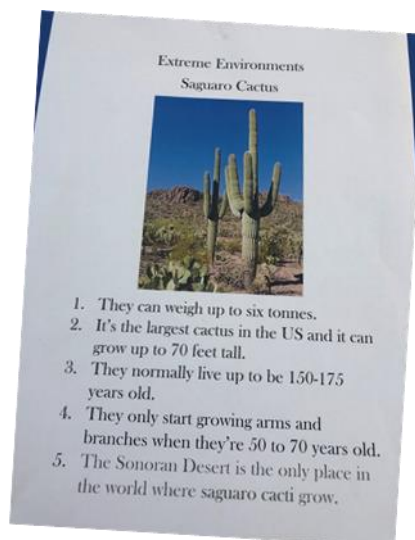
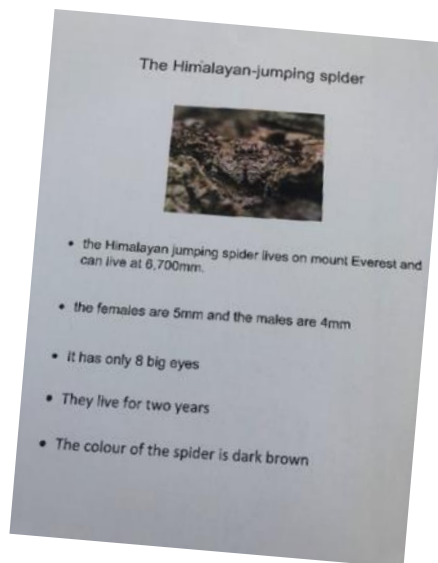
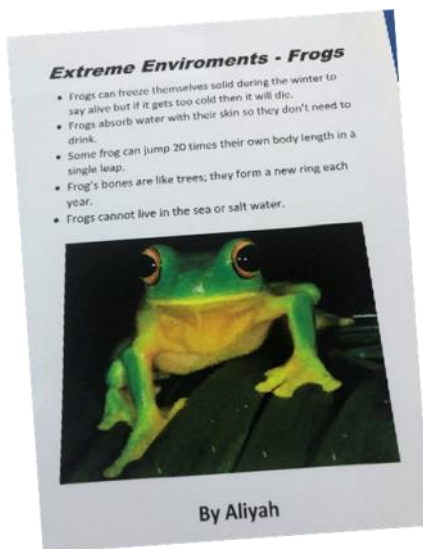
Inside the Classroom— Yr 6 Maturkunde—Science

The Unit of Inquiry in Science is Biology-based this term. Students are investigating that growth and survival of living things are affected by the physical conditions of their environment. To begin with, students shared their knowledge and understanding of what types of environments exist and how these can change through natural and man-made disasters.

The focus is on extreme environments, where life is nearly impossible due to high or low temperatures, pressure, content of oxygen, carbon dioxide in the atmosphere, high levels of radiation, absence of water, and the presence of toxic substances.

The students researched forms of life that live in extreme environments and presented their findings. They chose animals such as the Greenland Shark, the Giant Kangaroo Rat, the Snailfish, Frogs, the microscopic Tardigrade (Water Bear), the Himalayan Jumping Spider, Polar Bear, the Snow Leopard and the Saguaro Cactus.

Further investigations will include extinction events and how human disasters impact

Dear BSPS families,

Raising a teenager is no picnic! On one hand, you want to respect boundaries and give your growing child the freedom to make—and learn from—their own mistakes. On the other hand, you want to do everything in your power to protect your child from... well, everything.

When it comes to online safety, social media has its' own unique set of problems for children... and it can go far beyond the horror stories. That's why it's important as a parent to be involved with your child's use of social media. Remember, the legal age for the use of common social media sites and apps is **AGE 13**.

Not every parent is involved in social media. If your teen is using social media... that is a good reason why you should be too.

Even if you don't use social media actively, you should be friends with your teen so you can routinely check and see their posts. Not only will this give you a chance to see what's really going on in their mind but you can also recognize inappropriate behavior or posts, such as posting personal information.

WHAT IS SOCIAL NETWORKING?

Social networking describes a range of websites and mobile applications that allow users to create a personal profile and connect, interact, and share with other users from around the world.

Social networking allows young people to connect with friends and family, share photos and videos, play games, and chat with other users online.

Many young people may have multiple social media accounts and this often forms an integral part of developing their social identity.

WHAT ARE THE CHALLENGES OF SOCIAL NETWORKING?

Issues may arise when young people are accepting 'followers' (people) who they do not know in the real world as friends, or when they receive aggressive or hostile communication from friends or followers.
