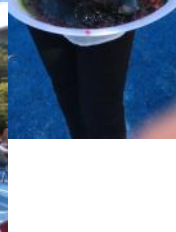

SRC – Recycling Week and Environmental Action

Over the course of the year, our Student Representative Council (SRC) members have been wondering how students can better support our school environment. In conjunction with National Recycling week, our SRCs have been encouraging students and staff to be more mindful about their daily waste habits at school, in particular in our classrooms.

Students have brainstormed the need for wrapper free lunches and snacks, using the new composting bins for vegetable and fruit scraps and being diligent about placing paper waste into paper recycling bins.

In addition, the school has been trying to be more sustainable by having LED lights installed across the school. An outcome of our recent school sustainability review will mean that in 2019 solar panels will be installed. Plans are also underway for our former chicken coop to be 'redeveloped' into a plant growing area as part of our science curriculum, which will be largely student operated. Ideas are also afoot to create space in the upstairs area to be used as a mindfulness/quiet space.

Our ever-expanding student-led cleaning/environmental crew continues to find new ways to show their care and support of the school's outside environment, including weeding, sweeping, collecting any rubbish and generally taking pride in our school grounds.

The SRCs thank everyone for their recycling efforts and care of our school environment.



Christmas Gift Appeal



It is sobering to realise there are local families who will struggle to buy even simple gifts at Christmas. Nationally, one in eight Australians live in poverty and one in six children are affected. Christmas can be a bleak time for many people.

This year we are again supporting the Christmas Gift Appeal, which helps families, children and teenagers in need in our local area. UnitingCare Harrison, based at Knox City, will then donate

these gifts to families with children in our local community who may otherwise go without this Christmas.

From Our School Chaplain

What Activities Energise and Engage Your Children?

It's been estimated that one in two students that finish school only have a vague idea about what they want to do with their lives. Often they choose tertiary courses that lead to careers that are valued by their parents and their schools. They may have an aptitude for this course but it doesn't engage and excite them. They become lawyers, mechanics, accountants, engineers or doctors, yet the activities that sustained them as children may have been something completely different, such as cooking, writing or tinkering with things. Many children will end up spending their entire working lives in jobs that they have an aptitude for and that pay the bills, but they have no real passion for. That means their working lives will become a constant battle. When you find the 'thing' you love to do your work may still be hard, but it's never a chore! Your ideal job will more likely enable you to experience real success and satisfaction, which you can't measure in dollars and cents!

What activities energise your children?

The key to understanding this is the concept of 'flow'. This is the state of getting so fully immersed in an activity that you forget about time and place. Moreover, the activity gives, rather than robs you of energy. Sports people and performers call it 'getting in the zone'. Writers and other creative people understand this concept as 'flow'. Children practise flow a lot. Sometimes flow is easy to recognise. For instance, actor Geoffrey Rush as a boy was forever making up little plays and acting out different characters at home. He was a natural thespian, yet he followed the traditional career route into tertiary education. He joined a theatre group while studying at university and a new career was unleashed.

Often the state of 'flow' is the cause of conflict or family argument. Your son may be late for dinner because he is forever tinkering - he may be either taking his skateboard apart and putting it back together again, or doing something creative with his hands. It seems his brain works best when his hands are busy. He is also the happiest when he is working with his hands.

The clues will be there when your children are young, but we often don't recognise them. So don't throw the schoolbooks out and ignore your children's report cards! Those too will hold clues to your children's futures. But keep your eye out for the activities that your children just LOVE to do! The secrets to a lifetime of happiness and success may well lay in the passionately embraced activities of childhood.

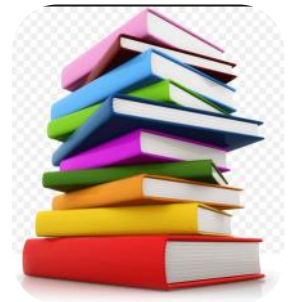

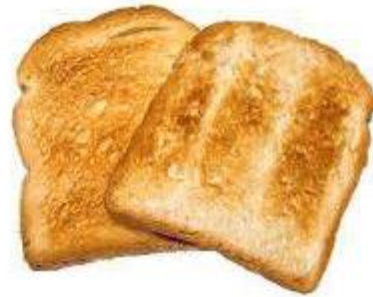
