From Our School Chaplain

Disciplining Children Is A Challenging Role For Parents

Discipline is an extremely important part of parenting. It's about keeping your children safe, making them fit in socially and enhancing their chances of success. It's also about getting them to cooperate and make life easier for all involved. Discipline can be relatively easy if you have easy-going children or they are in particular stages of their development. But getting cooperation from children who are strong willed, going through a difficult stage, or who have a temperament that clashes with you, can be a very demanding role for parents. Get it right and family life is good. Don't have strategies in place or consequences worked out, and parenting can be a constant struggle.

Effective parents use a broad range of strategies to promote appropriate behaviour and change behaviours that are not what you'd like them to be. They also use strategies that involve consequences, behaviour rehearsal, and other forms of teaching to help children behave well.

Here are five principles to keep in mind as you teach your children -

1. Avoid your first impulse when children misbehave. Try to respond calmly to the behaviour, rather than react impulsively. It's so easy to react without really thinking to behaviour we don't like, so it's important to challenge yourself to respond appropriately if you are going to change your children's misbehaviour. So spend time working out how better you can respond to the behaviours you dislike, and how you can approach them calmly without making them into a bigger deal than they need to be.
2. The more time you spend teaching your children to behave well, the less time you'll need to spend responding to poor behaviour. Get better at responding to their good behaviour and make this your focus, and that which deserves your full attention.
3. Children all want attention and time from their parents. If they don't get it, they will make sure they do one way or another using any method they can to gain your attention, and this may be via bad behaviour. Make sure you spend one on one time with your children every day you can, and watch how their behaviour improves, you'll be amazed! But don't expect changes to happen overnight, your children will test you to see whether it's short lived or is to be part of your family routine, so it may take a while for changes in their behaviour to occur.
4. When you get tired or stressed it's easy to throw your parenting techniques out the window, so if that means yelling to get cooperation, then that's what you'll probably do. The key is to practise better techniques when you aren't stressed so that when you do get tired, your responses will be better. Get plenty of sleep and rest as much as you're able to, and have some 'me' time to relax and re-energise.
5. Effective parents have many strategies to use when their children misbehave, rather than just one or two techniques to improve behaviour. Build on your repertoire of tools by reading parenting material and chatting to parents you admire. This will help you to promote better behaviour in your own home and get the best cooperation from your children possible. Anglicare Parentzone have a Parenting Newsletter you can download for free which is informative and very practical.
