## From the Assistant Principal

Dear BSPS families,

With four weeks left of school for 2018, staff are currently working hard to collate student assessment data and prepare student reports. Literacy and numeracy teachers at BSPS use an Assessment Schedule in order make best use of summative and formative assessment which is needed to show where a student is currently at, as well as identify the future learning needs of our students.

Some of the Assessment programs utilised for reports are:

### **Essential Assessment (Numeracy and Literacy – Writing and Reading)**

A differentiated assessment and curriculum model that diagnostically assesses each student and provides them with aligned curriculum to grow each students' knowledge from their current understanding.

### **PAT Maths/PAT Reading**

This assessment addresses the mathematical processes of understanding, fluency, problem solving and reasoning. The skills (numeracy and reading) assessed by each question are mapped against the Australian National Curriculum

### **Fountas and Pinnell (Reading)**

Accurate, insightful assessment tools to determine independent and instructional reading levels, and plan responsive instruction.

### **PM Benchmarks/Running Records**

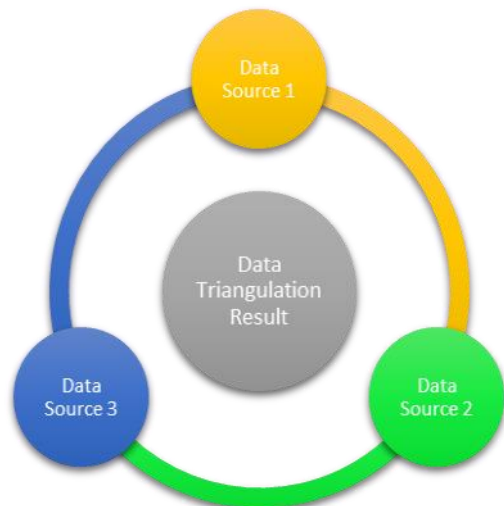
This program assists teachers to explicitly assess students' instructional and independent reading levels using unseen, meaningful texts. The emphasis of the assessment procedure is to ensure that students are comprehending the texts that they read.

### **VCOP (Writing)**

**A comprehensive, evidence-based assessment tool (linked to the Australian National Curriculum), that develops consistency and accuracy of writing assessment right across school.**

### **National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)**

NAPLAN is a nationwide test that assesses the skills of students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 in the areas of reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy.



Triangulation of our Assessment data for Reporting:

Triangulation facilitates validation of data through cross verification from more than two sources. It tests the consistency of findings obtained through different assessments.

Triangulation of data – Teachers have focused on utilizing three data sources to help make teacher judgements based on curriculum reporting levels more stringent.

At BSPS we use three different data sources from different assessments to cross check results and make sure the results reported are validated and consistent for each student.

Reports will be emailed to parents and ready to download on the Sentral Parent Portal on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> December and hardcopies of student class placements will also be sent home on this date.

Parents are encouraged to make sure that all contact information (especially email addresses) are up to date as this is the primary means by which student reports are communicated. If you miss receiving any reports on this date (Wed 19<sup>th</sup> Dec) by email, please contact the office straight away and we will resend the report with the correct email address.

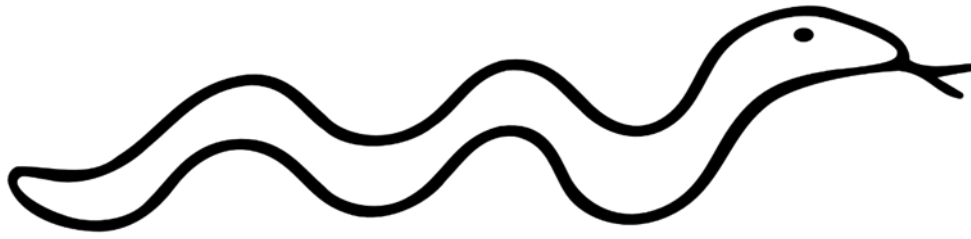
