## From the Assistant Principal

### Playground Project Update

Dear BSPS Community,

As you may well have noticed, there has been some major action going on around the 1/2 playground, prep playground and oval areas this week. As well as providing the students with a continuing source of entertainment and interest (who doesn't want to watch a large digger move huge rocks and dig big holes all day!), this work is geared towards redeveloping and landscaping a number of areas in and around our current junior playgrounds and creating some play, sensory and learning spaces for the students and community.

This project has been awhile in the making and has involved feedback and ideas from SRC students, school leaders and all staff in 2018. The project then progressed onto school council, where parents were involved in the design and decision making process. Funding of the project has come about through the fantastic fundraising work of the Parents Club and allocated school budget. With the tender process completed late last year, we were excited to get work started as early as we could this term and are looking forward to having the project finished by the end of Term 1.



#### **Project overview**

'Stairway to heaven' (left) This will be the new pathway from the asphalt area up to the oval. Gone will be the fenced 'pond' area and gravel stairs. Now students will have access to the recently remodelled oval by travelling straight up a graded slope through imposing rock pillars and landscaping.

The middle area (right), will link the pathway up to the oval, the prep playground (including the sandpit) and the 3/4 climbing playground area. This new 'middle section' will have a great view out over the lower parts of the school while creating a new 'destination play area' for students.



This space (left) currently occupied by a multitude of impressive mudstone rocks, will develop into a large natural amphitheatre carved into the side of the hill under the prep playground area. This amphitheatre will provide a terrific space for student play as well as an outdoor learning space with seating for multiple classes to utilise.

This area (right) behind the OHSC building will also be developed as part of this project into a landscaped and gardened sensory area providing seating, shade and views of the school.



We hope you are as excited as we are by the potential positive impact on the school that this project will bring. There may be more to come with this project in fact, but we will keep a little surprise in our back pockets to reveal to you at a later time. Stay tuned!!!

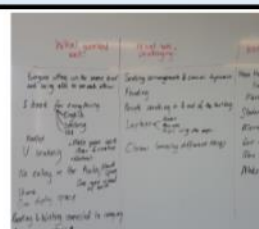


## Tuning In

### Welcome to Grade 5/6!

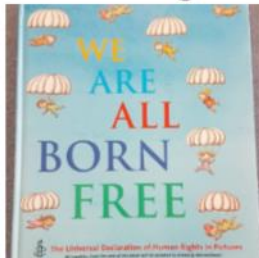
- No running, jumping or rapid movements
- No talking unless the teacher asks you to talk
- No smiling or expressions of joy
- No play
- No technology
- No sick days
- No recess. Lunch time will be limited to 15 minutes eating time.
- No names. Girls will be called Sally and boys will be called Bob.
- No chairs. Students will stand at all times.
- No questioning the teacher or the rules. The rules are non-negotiable.

We began the year by organising a provocation where students' lost their rights and where the learning environment was quite disrupted. We also reflected on what worked last year and things that they enjoyed in their previous classrooms.



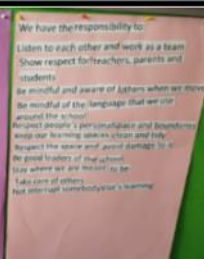
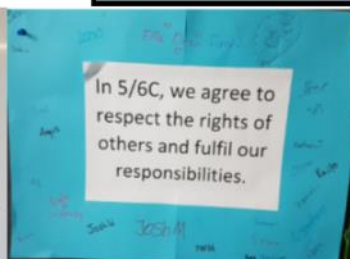
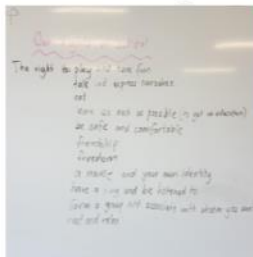
## Finding Out

We have found out more about rights by reading related books, researching the universal declaration of human rights and watching BTN.



## Sorting Out

We have sorted out our ideas by discussing what rights and responsibilities are most important at school, setting goals for ourselves and using concept mapping to show connections between ideas.

We have begun going further by encouraging students to think more about their rights at school, providing time for independent research and making links to persuasive writing as a way of arguing for change.



## From Our PYP Coordinator



Welcome to our very first **Primary Years Programme (PYP)** update for 2019. This year, Bayswater South Primary School will continue on our journey to become an authorised IB World School.

As the PYP coordinator, my role is to support teachers, lead the development of whole school curriculum documents, de-mystify the PYP for parents and to liaise between the school and the IBO. My hope is that these sections in the newsletter will help to achieve these aims.

This term we're going to look at why Bayswater South Primary School has decided to become a PYP school, the 'essential elements' of the PYP curriculum model, what it looks like in practice at different levels of the school and how it can enhance the existing bilingual program.

The PYP curriculum model (above) has at its heart the learner profile. By providing learning experiences for our students that focus on the acquisition of knowledge, conceptual understandings, attitudes and approaches to learning we hope to create internationally minded learners who can take action to make a difference in the world. One of the things that it's important to remember is that the PYP is not just our Programme of Inquiry, it is the philosophy behind everything that happens in our classrooms and impacts on all areas of the curriculum.

One question I get asked regularly is '**why do you work in a PYP school?**' For me, it's about acknowledging that the world is constantly changing, that we are more connected than ever before and that basic literacy and numeracy skills will not be enough for the learners and workers of the future.

What I like most about the PYP is its commitment to challenging and rigorous programs of education that develop a wide range of skills while developing understandings that students can apply wherever life may lead them. The challenge of catering for 21st Century learners is a real one. As Fisch and MeLeod put it, "We are currently preparing students for jobs that don't yet exist . . . using technologies that haven't been invented . . . in order to solve problems we don't even know are problems yet."
